Fitness standards

Do you need any further justification for urging your son to be involved in our sports and weights training / core fitness programs all year? It was reported (18/11/06) that in the Long Beach School District, California, fewer than one teenager in three could meet overall performance targets. Tests in grades 5, 7 & 9 assess aerobic capacity, body composition, abdominal strength and endurance, trunk strength and flexibility, upper body strength and overall flexibility. 25.6% of 5th graders, 29.6% of 7th graders and 27.4% of 9th graders met all six standards. Sedentary lifestyles and poor eating habits were blamed for the poor overall performance. At High we stress strenuous mental and physical activity for a balanced lifestyle. How are you managing your personal fitness?

Main Building Engineering Report



RHM Consulting Engineers presented their report this week, following their January inspection. The fir trees were found to be excessive in size, given

their proximity to the building. The settlement of the Main building has caused clockwise rotation in the extending bays where the Deputy Principals' offices are located on the ground floor, resulting in damage to the roof, ceiling covings and piers. The engineers recommend: reducing the fir trees height by 50% or removing them; proceeding with penetrometer tests around the building to ascertain soil strength; and *Uretex* injection beneath the bays to re-level the building. The building is not in any danger, however, the previous mortar repairs and loose material on the first floor piers should be removed to avoid injury to people. Until the full underground injections are carried out the corridor will be 'aesthetically displeasing', but not dangerous.

School Council Delegates

Staff representation on the School Council is important to school governance. Mr Stein, Ms May and Ms Crothers are current members. Additional members are: Ms Lim, Ms Walles, Ms Dam and Mr Walker. Apart from the Annual General Meeting, members are encouraged to contact each other to act as alternates to ensure that a quorum of members is maintained for every meeting.

Participation in School Life – Student Award Scheme

In the Annual School Report data about the scheme are published. Comparisons between 2005 and 2006 revealed an uneven but upward trend. Year 12 last year increased

participation by 85% with 61 awards. Year 10 was up 53% with 92 awards. Year 7 improved 48% to 80 awards. Year 8 was up 25% with 79 awards. Years 9 and 11 decreased by 8% each with 68 and 57 awards, respectively.

High Junior and Senior School Assemblies

Our first split school assemblies were held last Friday. The theme of the assemblies was 'recognising student participation'. Awardees assembled in the cloisters to receive their medallions while all other students were seated in the Great Hall. The awardees paraded to the stage in groups according to the level of their awards not their academic years as their names were read out. They had their group photograph taken with the Principal. Given the volume of engraved medallions to distribute, this process seemed to work well. Future assemblies will have their own themes and involvement by student leaders and performers.

2nd Grade VS SIC Match Report


