This year has seen the completion of the project to recognise the Old Boy recipients of Order of Australia awards, with the unveiling of the honour board to commemorate Old Boy

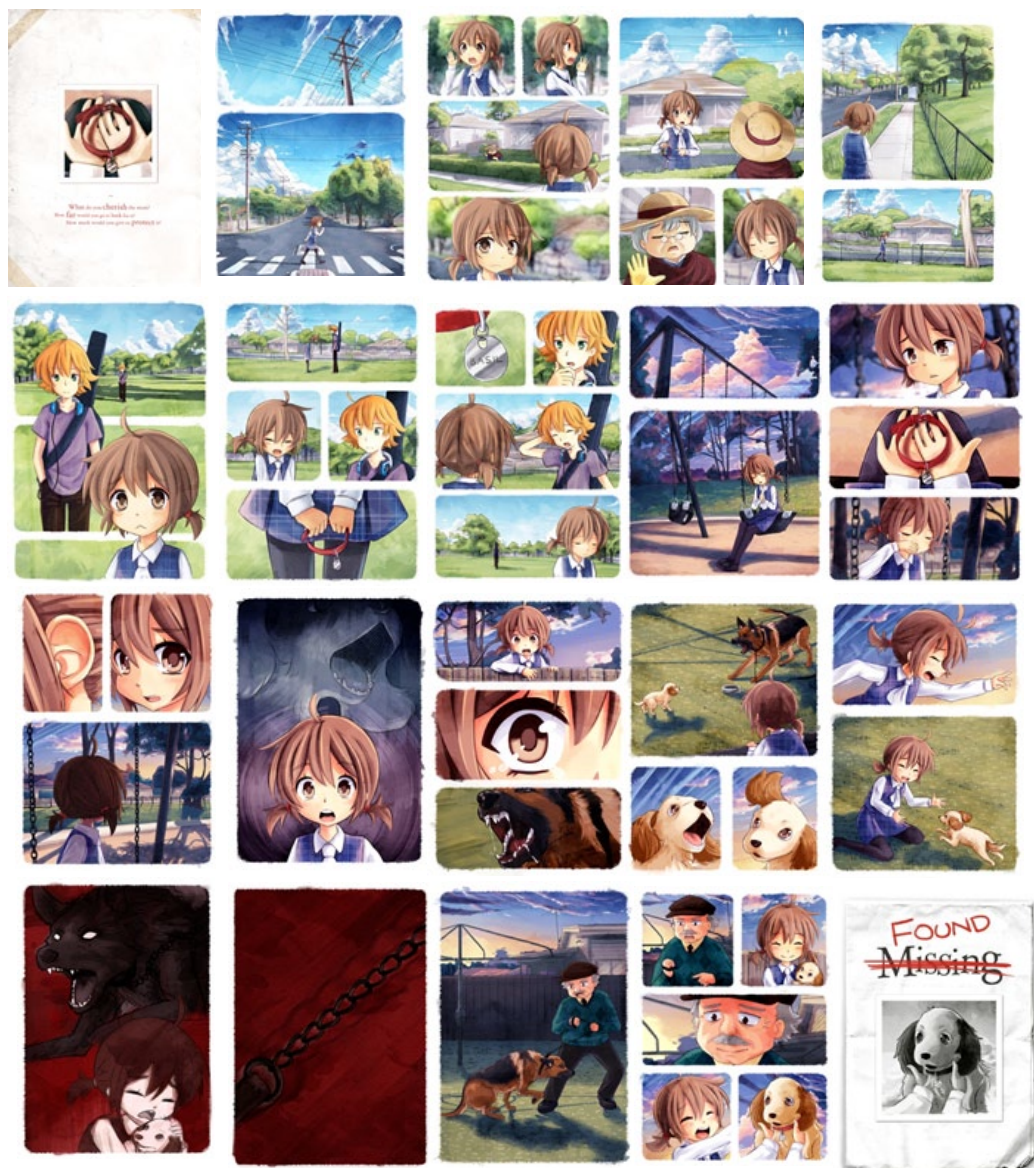

# COMMUNITY SERVICE

Over 2011 the Sydney Boys High Community Service Committee 2011 raised an extraordinary \$118 811 through a diverse range of carefully planned events. The World's Greatest Shave amassed \$3200 for the Leukaemia Foundation. The joint SBHS-SGHS UNICEF Day for Change generated \$5000 with substantial help from the Islamic Society of Sydney Boys High. Our Red Cross Blood Drives saved over three hundred lives. The Ramen for Japan and Stewart House Donation initiatives were successful.

The developing relationship with the Cleveland Street Intensive English High School has been a particular highlight, with

our Convo@Clevo program attracting over sixty senior student volunteers who visit their school every Friday morning, on a rotational basis, as mentors/conversationalists. Cleveland Street Intensive English High School attended our Harmony Day and UNICEF events. Several of us participated in their Harmony Day celebrations, which showcased their multiculturalism on stage. Alongside this have been two new programs introduced this year: Bourke St Buddies-supporting our local primary school students and Kidzone-assisting young residents with homework at Vincentian House, a nearby St Vincent de Paul crisis accommodation facility.

# VOLLEYBALL GLORY



The Australian Volleyball Schools Cup was a phenomenal experience for the Sydney High 16s Volleyball team. Our team, consisting of Yu Peng Man, Kevin Lu, Jason Garret, Samuel Phillis, Gordon Qin, Byron Chen, Jason Le, Pinyan Gao, Shawn Noronha and Coach Ritam Mitra, trained hard throughout the volleyball season and played fiercely during the tournament. After five days of gruelling volleyball where we played a total of nine games, our training and hard work paid off when we won the gold medal and were crowned the undefeated 16s Boys Division 2 Australian Volleyball Schools Cup Champions, only dropping three sets the whole tournament!

In addition, our High volleyball teams were GPS champions again in 2011. High won gold medals at the NSW All Schools in U14, U15, U16 and

Open divisions. The U15s were tenacious in their approach to the GPS games winning the majority of their matches against Grammar. But by a whisker, the standout performance was probably the Under 14s nail biting victory over Kelso in the gold medal playoff for the U15 division of the NSW All Schools. Not only did the boys show a steely resolve, they were playing up an age division.

Chris Morrow was selected for the NSW CHS team (for the third year). Chris was also selected in the AIS Junior Development squad and the Australian U19 team to tour Thailand. Amandeep Dhaliwal was selected in the Australian U17 All Stars 7. This team represents the seven best junior volleyballers in Australia.



# BASKETBALL TRIUMPH



The stands were packed with supporters and spectators watching the two competition favourites battle it out when Sydney Boys High School defeated the invitational team, the Chinese under 17 National side, at the recent Australian All Schools National Championships. Sydney High has been awarded the Champion Basketball School of Australia for the second year in a row making High one of only three schools to have ever achieved this in history.

The Chinese team sported very fast aggressive guards and very tall, lanky forwards (the tallest at 215cm). SBHS was able to penetrate the Chinese defence and minimise their scoring threats. The SBHS lead slowly increased by each quarter and eventually surpassed China. A mixture of individual talent and teamwork ensured the back to back championship.



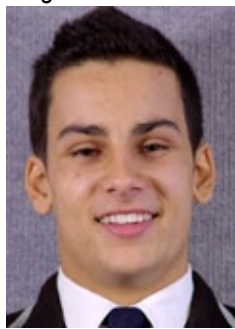
# HIGHLIGHTS
