NESA requirements



The Record of School Achievement (RoSA) is a cumulative credential containing a student's record of academic achievement

RoSA is for eligible students who leave school before completing the HSC (rare at SBHS)

NESA requirements



To be eligible for a RoSA, students must have:

- Completed the mandatory curriculum requirements for Years 7 to 10
- Completed courses of study that satisfy Education Standards' curriculum and assessment requirements for the RoSA

Mandatory Stage 5 RoSA Requirements

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- ► PDHPE
- History (completed in Year 9)
- Geography (completed in Year 9)



Criteria for satisfactory completion of a course

The student is considered to have satisfactorily completed a course if he has:

- 1. followed the course developed or endorsed by NESA;
- 2. applied themselves with diligence and sustained effort to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course by the school; and
- 3. achieved some or all of the course outcomes.

N.B Satisfactory completion of the Year 9 component of a course is a pre-requisite for entry into the Year 10 component of the same course

Subject choices should be based on:

- 1. Interests
 - What provides you with enjoyment?
 - What will motivate you to apply yourself?
- 2. Strengths
 - Which course are you more likely to succeed in?
- 3. Career or future study needs (including HSC or University)
 - Should align with points 1 & 2 anyway
 - Information on Year 11 and 12 subjects is on the school website under Curriculum/Subject Choices



Subject choices should <u>NOT</u> be based on:

- What your friends choose
 - Different interests, strengths & potentially different classes
- A specific teacher
 - The teacher might not teach the subject next year or may teach a class that you are not in



How to Pick Courses (for parents)



- Your son will be studying the course
- Happier children will be better off
- Success and enjoyment filters to other courses studied
- Students often struggle doing courses not suited to them

Which subjects are prerequisites for HSC study?

- Study of Continuers Languages in Years 11 & 12 assumes study at Year 10 level
- Preliminary Music 2 (and HSC Music Extension) require study at Year 10 level
- Therefore:
- If a boy wishes to study Continuers Languages or Music at HSC level, he should choose that subject to study in Year 9
- For other subjects it may be an advantage to study the subject in Stage 5, but is not a requirement



Choosing Electives



- Students submit their preferences online through Edval
- They nominate four preferences:
 - the first two preferences are used unless some problem arises
 - If there is a problem, the third choice (or if necessary fourth) will replace the preference with the problem

How are these preferences used?

- Subjects are grouped into timetable lines based on student preferences to maximise student choice
- It's not always possible for every student to study what he has chosen
 - Some subjects often have only one class e.g French, Music, German, Latin, Visual Arts
 - Some of these subjects will have to appear in the same line causing "clashes"
 - Highly demanded courses may have limits due to staffing
 - e.g. 32 boys might choose a subject and only one class of 30 may be running. 2 boys will have to be eliminated.
 - Boys who have given the subject the lowest ranking will be identified and 2 boys will be removed.

Some considerations

- Always place subjects in order of preference TWO + TWO reserves
- Don't blindly list reserves you have no interest in
- No decisions on subjects are made until 9am Tuesday Week 10 just enter preferences on time
- Many students thought they entered different courses so be careful what you enter
 - e.g Visual Design vs Visual Arts
- You may choose to discontinue a course after completing Year 9 requirements and select another course in its place for Year 10
- Decision on entry into advanced courses based on Year 8 performance
 - Chinese vs Chinese Advanced
 - Music vs Music Advanced
- Enter your preferences early to confirm Edval access
 - go back and change later if needed
- Class numbers based on original interest
 - A later change of course request may be for a course not even running
 - e.g. Visual Design 2023 & 2024



Some considerations

- Study of and strong performance in some Year 9 courses needed for Year 10 acceleration opportunities e.g. 9 Commerce for Business Studies, 9 Music for Music 2, 9 D&T/Graphics Design for D&T
- Some courses must be studied in Year 9 to take in Year 10:
 - Photographic & Digital Media Advanced
 - Languages (recommended require additional study to pick up)
 - Commerce (recommended but not essential)

N.B. Students seeking direct entry into Year 10 PDM Advanced must demonstrate requisite knowledge

Places in more challenging courses in Year 10 have minimum academic requirements e.g. Computing Tech, Online Learning, Philosophy



Class Groupings



- Year 9 electives not grouped by ability
- Year 9 core classes have three grouped classes
 - English & Science combined score
 - English
 - Science
- Mathematics
 - 3 grouped classes

N.B. Mathematics classes may change for new students in Term 2 using cohort paper results

Early entry into HSC courses

Opportunities may exist for Year 10 students to commence study of certain HSC subjects

e.g. Modern History, Geography, Business Studies, Music and languages.

- To be eligible for acceleration, students must demonstrate in Year 9 that they are well above average in each of their subjects
- Continuation in accelerated courses based on ongoing performance



What if I change my mind?



Preferences close <u>9am Tuesday Week 10</u>

- In <u>Week 10 of Term 4 ONLY</u>, after Year 8 reports distributed, students may email any course change requests to Mr J Kay
- Students may change courses in first 3 weeks of Term 1

N.B. Once timetable lines are formed and the timetable is underway your new preferences may or may not be possible

- In demand-courses
- Line clashes

New students in 2025

- Enter subject selections using preference sheets already sent to you & return to the school
- Same preference given as current SBHS students
- Consider background study in Languages as already enrolled students would have had 2 years of study already
