Monthly Giving Program

The P&C and the School will shortly commence an active campaign to reacquaint our School community with the Monthly Giving Program. We are calling for volunteers from the school community who can assist with this project. Please contact Julie Connolly jcandjc@bigpond.net.au or 0418 470 203 if you can spare some time to telephone fellow parents and speak to them about the Monthly and Annual Giving Programs.

The School has short, medium and long term building and grounds projects that are part of the School's overall plan to provide the best facilities and educational programs it can, to further the School's ethos of the pursuit of all-round excellence. To achieve these goals, the School depends upon its community of parents, Old Boys and supporters for financial support. Planned projects include Stage Two: Library and Multipurpose Centre. We have \$800,000 so far allocated to Stage Two. We need to at least double this.

The tax deductible Monthly Giving Program helps to fund these building and development goals. An

arrangement is in place with ANZ Bank for automatic monthly deductions from a nominated credit card. You can elect to give \$50, \$40, \$30, \$20 or \$10 each month for a period of twelve months. Your nominated amount, along with name and credit card details are sent to the bank electronically. At the end of the financial year, the school issues an annual statement as evidence of tax deductible donations. You can opt in or out of the scheme by notifying the school in writing five working days before the 15th of each month.

Wet Weather Information



Saturday Sport

For regular updates on Saturday sport during times of inclement weather, parents and students are asked to check the school's website throughout the day. The information can be found by going to the school's website at www.sydneyboyshigh.com then by clicking on the fixture details under the heading of 'Upcoming events' i.e. Saturday, May 8 SHS v SGS and St Augustine's. Cancellations can then be found by scrolling down the page to the specific sport and team. If there is no information specific to sport cancellations then assume by default that sport will go ahead. Please note that the current 'Sports Wet Weather line' is inoperable.

Changes to Sport Policy

Students and parents should read the changes to the School's Sport Policy which is detailed on the school's website and outlined below:

Sport Policy

Sydney Boys High encourages participation in team sports for educational reasons. Team sports build a sense of belonging in boys, a connectedness with the school; teamwork skills are developed; individual self-confidence and self-esteem are enhanced through group endeavour; and socialisation at school is fostered through ready topics of conversation among team members. Teams help and protect their members.

Sydney Boys High is unique among NSW state secondary schools due to its membership since 1906 of the Athletic Association of Great Public Schools, formed in 1892 to order and regulate sporting fixtures for schools with senior students. The other eight members of this Association (commonly called the 'GPS') are private schools.

The school expects students to engage in at least one GPS sport per year. This commitment includes Saturday competition. We encourage boys to get involved in aerobic fitness activities (the athletics and cross country programs) to help them in their chosen sports. To help their strength in anaerobic activities we offer supervised weights training.

The policy of the school is that sport is compulsory all year for students in Year 7, Year 8, Year 9, Year 10 and Year 11 and for up until the HSC exams in Year 12. Those students who are unable to participate in Saturday sport are to address this in writing with complete details to the Head Teacher-

Sport at the beginning of the year.

It is the policy of the school to support GPS sports in the season that they are contested by the members of the Athletic Association of the Great Public Schools.

This means that equipment costs, venue hire, travel to certain venues, particular coaching fees, competition entry fees, charges for referees or umpires, capitation fees and entry fees for knockout competitions, are paid for from school funds. Competition entry fees for representative teams for all sports are paid for from school funds. The school charges parents a global fee and in addition, a sports levy, to cover these costs.

Saturday Sport Absences

During the recent summer season it was noticed that a number of students were absent from sport on Saturdays with no explanation. These led to a number of embarrassing incidents, where teams were left short and apologies were made to the opposing school. For Sydney Boys High School to be recognised as a serious opponent in the AAGPS, then a number of changes have been made to rectify this problem for future Saturday fixtures.

Students and parents are asked to communicate known absences to the Master in Charge (MIC) and to their specific team coach in the week leading up to the match. If a student is ill, it is expected the illness will be communicated directly to the coach and Master in Charge (MIC) on the day of the match. Students who do not communicate illnesses or absences will be given a warning 'Yellow Card'. A further breach in terms of an unexplained absence will mean a red card in which the student will be suspended from the sport for 2 weeks. If a third unexplained absence occurs, then the student will be removed from the sport for the remainder of the season. For a student to receive credit towards their Half Yearly and Yearly Reports, 100% attendance or full communication of absences is expected.

In summary:

First unexplained absence = warning, Yellow Card

Second unexplained absence = Removed from the sport for two weeks, Red Card

Third unexplained absence = removed from the sport for the remainder of the season

100% attendance = credit given for participation on Half Yearly/Yearly Reports



SENIOR RUGBY

Senior Rugby players which include the 16s have been involved in working together to improve the standard of Rugby played at High.

The key strategic areas we can improve upon are

1. **Strength**
2. **Speed and Agility**
3. **Skills (Defence and attacking guides.)**
4. **Vision.**

Each individual senior player can check their Conditioning and Rugby training attendance on spreadsheets soon to be posted on the Senior Rugby Notice Board located in the Canteen Area.

A number of Year 10 and Year 11 players will need to improve their attendance to these sessions if they are to be recognised by the school for their efforts.

The following players have been regular with their Conditioning and Rugby training and as a consequence will trial at the 1st XV level.

What is pleasing to see is the consistent logging and enthusiasm most of the **Year12 players** are bringing to the group as a whole. The **1st XV player** must consistently complete at least **5 sessions** of training a week.

- A minimum of **2 sessions of strength training** in the school gym under the guidance of Mr Tassell.
- **3 sessions of Rugby** one of which includes a **sprint and agility session**.

The **2nd XV and 16A player** must consistently log **4 sessions** of training a week.

- A minimum of **1 session of strength training** in the school gym under the guidance of Mr Tassell.
- **3 sessions of Rugby** one of which includes a **sprint and agility session**.

Note- Only under special known circumstances can players opt to include an extra strength session to make up for a missed Rugby training session.

This does not prevent any players from completing an extra strength training session if they wish to do so.

The strength training session must be signed by Mr Tassell in the Senior Rugby logbook and submitted to Mr Scrivener for logging.

The Rugby sessions are logged according to your attendance and participation on the following training days.

Monday 3:30 to 5:30pm at Moore Park West

Wednesday 1:30 to 3:30pm at Mackay

Thursday 3:30 to 5:30pm at Mackay

Wet weather- Training is always on and senior players are to meet in the gym.

Players must submit a signed note from their parent or guardian if unable to attend a training session preferably before the event.

A small number of players have indicated they want to play rugby but find it difficult to follow the strict training schedule for a variety of reasons. Unfortunately, the school cannot provide sporting references or student sporting awards to the senior students who have played limited rugby or do not log consistently.

Many institutions (eg Sydney University) are now seeking students who not only perform academically but respond strongly to sporting challenges. Please check your logging before you think you should be rewarded for your participation in GPS Rugby.

THE 'JAGGAR GIFT'

The Race of Champions

Sydney High Athletics, Cross Country and the PD/Health/PE Department are holding the "Jaggar Gift" on Moore Park West. The race will be run as a handicap to give all competitors an equal chance of success. The top ten 1.6km athletes from each Year in the junior school (Years 7, 8 and 9) and the senior school (Years 10, 11 and 12) will be given the opportunity to participate in this race. Year 12 students may self nominate. The junior race will run first, following a 3 minute interval the senior race will commence.. The 'Jaggar Gift' will take place on Monday 24th May 2010 on a modified 1.6km course on Moore Park West.

Brief history of 'Gift Races'

The earliest record of athletics competition in Australia was from 1810 in Hyde Park, Sydney where Dicky Dowling won a sprint race over 50 yards. Professional athletics grew considerably around this time. Stories of huge crowds placing enormous wagers on the success of incredible feats of athletes paint a colourful picture of the sport in these early days. Professional foot racing boomed during the mid 1800s particularly in the gold rush towns of New South Wales and Victoria. Miners raced against each other in handicapped races for the gift of a gold nugget offered by the mine owner. 'Gift' races were born.

How does the race work on the day?

We will compute your handicap according to the 1.6k runs you have completed over the last year to determine your starting time. A list of runners will be posted around the school over the coming weeks. The runner with the largest predicted handicap starts first. For the start, the clock is set at this number of seconds and begins counting down. Other runners start when their handicap time (written on their race number - bib) comes up on the clock. When the clock reaches zero, all runners have started.

Instructions to competitors:

1. Juniors and seniors will pick up their race number (with handicap time), safety pins and be marked off on the race list from the History Staff room.
2. You must wear the proper PE/Athletics gear. Runners who turn up in the wrong gear will NOT race.

RACE RULES

3. Race numbers must be affixed on the **front** with a safety pin on each corner. Do this well beforehand.
4. **BE ON TIME and REMEMBER YOUR HANDICAP.** The first race will Start at 1:05pm SHARP with or without you, outside the Main Building on Moore Park West.
5. No pushing or shoving particularly as the faster runners make their way through the field past younger runners. Any interference with another runner will result in **disqualification**.
6. Runners on the tougher handicaps must take particular caution when passing runners in front of them. There are some points on the course that are not ideal for overtaking. *A runner in front of another runner must not hinder a runner coming from behind who is trying to overtake.*
7. At the completion of both races you will have approx 15 minutes to recover and change to be ready for period 5. Do not be late to class.
8. Race times and places will be published in High Notes.
