From the Principal Farewell edition for 2010



As this is our last High Notes for the year, I Farewell would like to thank all students, staff, parents,

Old Boys and friends of High who have contributed to all the great things that have happened at High this year. I want to thank all the regular contributors to High Notes and to our advertisers who have helped defray costs. In particular, I want to thank Cathy Northey, our High Notes editor, for her work this year in producing the publication each week. I urge all parents to have High Notes sent to them electronically.

School Certificate 2010

It is now official. Year 9 tried harder and performed better in the School Certificate tests in Australian Geography, History, Civics and Citizenship than their Year 10 counterparts. In Geography, 197 students earned a mean of 85.09 with a standard deviation of 4.67. Year 10 had 199 students achieve a mean of 84.07 with a standard deviation of 5.42. In band 6 results, Year 9 outshone Year 10 with 33 to 27. In History, the Year 9 mean was 81.99 with a standard deviation of 6.05, while Year 10 scored 81.37 with a standard deviation of 6.71. In band 6 results, Year 10 squeezed past Year 9 with 29 to 28. The experiment of having the courses compacted seems to have been a success in that it was practicable. The challenge for the next few years is whether we can both deliver the telescoped course and inspire the boys to want to perform well at the School Certificate examinations. I am confident that in succeeding years we will improve on both our delivery and on our results.

Group results for Year 10 in mathematics were: mean 92,94, SD 4.79, z-score 1.78 (obtained by dividing the difference between the school mean and the state mean by the state standard deviation). English literacy figures were: mean 86.03,SD 4.06, z-score 1.09. Science statistics were: mean 86.81, SD 5.0, z-score 0.99. Computing skills data were: mean 90.54, SD 4.32, z-score 1.02. The combined Australian History results for 396 boys were: mean 81.68, SD 6.38, zscore 1.02. The outcomes for Australian Geography for 396 students were: 84.58, SD 5.07 and z-score 1.09. The fears held by some, that having a very large cohort sit for some of the tests at the School Certificate and weaken the outcomes badly, were unfounded.

The Library Fund 2010



Contributions to the Library Fund in 2010 were \$110,263. We had the support of 882 of

families, c.76% population. We think that support of our two libraries is a most important foundation of our school funding strategy and I urge all families to contribute to the tax deductible supply of great services in two libraries. Total funds available were \$138,666. This year the funds were spent on the following: a new security system for the senior library (\$18,295), salaries, wages and overtime for both libraries and archives (\$85,229), books, journals, periodicals and photocopy, printing (\$32,068), maintenance (\$315). The carried forward amount is \$2684.64. In reality, the true costs of running both libraries were not all charged against the Library Fund. Approximately \$20,000 was covered by school funds. The estimated cost of running the two libraries for 2011 is: salaries, wages and overtime \$106,000; books, materials, journals, printing costs \$33,000. The school budget can only afford \$20,000 to be applied to the libraries. It is really important that the school community supports the learning of their sons at the 80% rate or better, if we are to maintain or improve existing services.

The Sydney Boys High School **Building Fund**



The Sydney Boys High Building Fund has two purposes: first, complete necessary capital maintenance works at school

and second, to accumulate funds for a major building project - a multi-purpose centre for performing arts. Donations for the year totalled \$165,013 or \$150 from 1100 families. Included in this figure are: distributions from the Centenary Building Fund, the Monthly Giving Scheme donations











and the One-Off donations, so fewer than 1100 families actually donated. Nonetheless, the great support from the High community is much appreciated. Interest of \$24,319.55 was accumulated, along with \$1,137 of recouped GST payments. Total receipts for the year were \$190,470.45, up 3.6% on 2009 despite lower interest payments due to the timing of term deposits rolling over. Total funds available were \$954,442. School refurbishment and capital maintenance expenses were \$53,318 and GST\$1621.38. The carried forward balance was \$899,502. The funding strategy for 2011 is to pare back on capital maintenance as much as possible to increase the ratio of the fund that is sequestered for future investment in a major building project. We also want to encourage additional donations to push ahead the quantum of the retained capital well past \$1,000,000 in 2011.

Financial Management



More frequent reporting of expenditures against budgets and more rigorous monitoring of expenses will be required from all MICs and program managers next year. The monthly income and expenditure spreadsheets produced by the Principal will be sent to MICs and P&C Committees by

the Head Teacher Sport or the Principal's Assistant for analysis. A completed spreadsheet detailing monthly expenditures and future expenditures will be required from each program. A compulsory briefing for MICs and Committee members will be held early in the term in 2011. The school's accounting system will be explained and the expectations for management, monitoring and reporting will be detailed. Managing the school's budget is a time-consuming and complex activity. Too many program managers are either untrained or neglectful of proper accounting process. This situation must change to avoid the embarrassing over expenditures that have crippled the budget in 2010.

New Books

House Rules by Jodi Picoult – Picoult's books usually deal with issues that have become relevant and often controversial in today's society. Despite her novels being about serious and important issues they are also compelling page-turners that have remained on the best seller lists for a long time. This book is about Jacob Hunt a teenage boy with Asperger's syndrome. Jacob is interested in forensic science and helps the police solve crimes but when his tutor is found dead it is he that is accused of murder.

The Returners by Gemma Malley – Will Hodge isn't happy at home or at school. When he begins to dream about the past and see strange people following him he realises that there is something significant and dangerous in his past, a "past far deeper than most", and which he has no recollection of. As he struggles to break free of the powerful hold that history has on him he realises that he is a "returner", "people who have been reincarnated and whose destiny is to recall the atrocities they have witnessed in the past." Other books by this critically acclaimed author are The Declaration and The Resistance both great reads and both set in a dystopian world as this one is.

The Shadow of the Wind by Carlos Ruiz Zafon – Described by reviewers as a Gothic, thriller, mystery novel set in post World War II Barcelona. This is a story within a story after Daniel, "initiated into the Cemetery of Forgotten Books by his father, chooses a book titled The Shadow of the Wind and becomes obsessed with the author whose tragic and dramatic life is revealed. Daniel's own life becomes intermingled with that of his author and the story becomes one described as "a big thrilling romp through glorious Barcelona, in pursuit of true love and an elusive writer." (Courier-Mail)

Into White Silence by Anthony Eaton – "During the winter of 1922, the exploration vessel Raven became trapped in the Antarctic icepack, entombing 28 men aboard it through the dark polar night." This novel is the story of the men amid the fascinating beauty and the terrible danger of Antarctica. (book blurb)

The Sound of One Hand Clapping by Richard Flanagan – recommended by a student at this school this novel set in Tasmania is the story of the mysterious disappearance of a mother and the relationship between daughter and father left behind. This is "a dazzling novel of war, family and migration...from one of Australia's most acclaimed writers." (book blurb)

Jasper Jones by Craig Silvey - this is a terrific read about a boy called Charlie Bucktin living in a small Australian country town during the summer of 1965. His help is enlisted by Jasper Jones, an outcast of mixedrace whom Charlie finds fascinating and admirable, "a figure of danger and intrigue", to find the killer of a local girl that Jasper has been seeing. Seen through the eyes of Charlie the reader experiences his feelings of guilt at keeping such a horrible secret, of first love, and his relationships with his best friend Jeffrey, his tempestuous mother and admired and stable father. This has been described as "an Australian To Kill a Mockingbird" (The Monthly) "impossible to put down...There's tension, injustice. young love, hypocrisy.." and fits in well with the belonging theme for HSC English course.

The Spire by Richard North Patterson – Best-selling author Patterson has written a new thriller. When Mark Darrow returns to his old school to catch up with his old mentor and professor Lionel Farr he becomes involved in a court case that will affect the outcome of a 16 year old murder trial where his best friend had been gaoled for life. After discovering that the case against his friend left crucial questions unanswered Darrow begins his own inquiry into the murder. When another mysterious death occurs he finds his own life in danger.

ALC (ASSESSMENT of LANGUAGE COMPETENCE) NATIONAL LANGUAGE CERTIFICATE TESTS

In 2010 students from Sydney Boys High School sat the ALC National Language Certificate Tests in French and German and achieved excellent results. Many students achieved well above the State average in both the Listening and Reading exams.

In French Certificate 2 (Intermediate), 100% of Year 9



students achieved Distinctions or Credits in Listening (State average 73.6%) and 92.3% in Reading skills (State average 72.4%). In Reading skills 61.5% of our students achieved

a Distinction compared to the State average of 25.1%.

In French Certificate 3 (Advanced), 93.9% of Years 10 and 11 students achieved a score of Credit, Distinction or High Distinction in Listening compared to the State average of 84.2% and 100% in Reading Skills (State average 84.3%).

In German Certificate 2 (Intermediate), 100% of Year



9 students achieved a score of Credit or Distinction in Listening compared to the State average of 67% and 88.9% in Reading (State average 68.9%).

In German Certificate 3 (Advanced), 85.7% of Year 10 students achieved a High Distinction, Distinction or Credit in Listening (State average 85.1%) with two students, Ennes Mehmedbasic and Michail Schwarz achieving perfect scores and 92.8% in Reading (State average 82.8%).

Set up Your Individual Parent Portal Login
