### CHS Rowing - Taree



High boys rowed well to win the Schoolboy Pointscore Trophy as usual, but were not able to retain the overall trophy won last year, due to the superior sculling of the SGHS crews. Tim Trent won three gold medals - the U15 single scull, the U15 double scull paired with Matthew Le and the U15 quad scull. – a great regatta for him. High won gold medals in all the quad sculls - U15 through to Championship. Jacob Katafono and Wesley Zhang won two golds and a silver each in the championship four, the championship eight and the championship pair. The coxed four was won by Johnson Lin, Ricky Pachon, Jacob Katafono, Wesley Zhang, c Alvis Leung. Jing Li and Alvis Leung won two gold medals each. Overall, eight gold, 8 silver and 7 bronze medals were won. No medals were won in six sculling events – an area of opportunity for the future. Thank you to Julie Blomberg, Beryl Crockford, Ken Ambler, Mark Gainford, Kevin Eadie, Chris Watson and Hayden Schilling for helping make the regatta work smoothly for our competitors. It was a great venue and a worthwhile experience.

## The School Plan 2015-17

### 4. - Planning milestones



In our planning process, milestones are activities we have scheduled to frame the implementation, achievement and impact of each of our three strategic directions. We need a means to validate our progress towards our goals – improvement, measures, products and practices. We believe milestones at intervals less than one term are unrealistic in our highly complex setting where evaluative systems are already in place in each of the four terms. The idea of simple colour coding – green, amber, red – is an attractive means of indicating how various milestones are being met, or not.

Five steps are recommended in the process of establishing milestones. A) Identify implementation milestones for measures, products or practices. B) Devise a monitoring process. C) Embed an appropriate means of ongoing evaluation. D) Plan effective use of resources. E) Measure achievement annually. In addition the DEC has some key funding initiatives, including equity loadings and beginning teacher support, which need to be accounted for within the school budget.

As a precursor to our planning, we need to identify what milestones we already have in place as a feature of our current practice. For example, HSC results for the cohort and for each course are analysed at the end of term 4 and in the first weeks of term 1 the following year. Achievement of targets is reviewed with each Head Teacher. New targets for the school and for each course are derived from comparisons with past performances and those of statistically similar schools. Targets are published in the Annual School Report. This process will be replaced by an annual self-evaluation publication.

## The Governors Centre for Excellence in Education – update

The 'project design team' – GHD and TKD – have submitted their final 'conceptual design' report. The PCG have selected option 1B as the preferred design. The project 'Quantity Surveyor' has costed the selected design at \$10.5m. There are two further stages in the design process – 'schematic design' and 'detailed design'. Each stage incurs substantial additional costs. Each school community has been asked to refer the next step to their governance organisations. In their last meetings, the P & C, the SBHS School Council and the SHS Foundation have all passed resolutions supporting the move to the next stage – schematic design' at an estimated cost of \$200k ( \$100k per school). If we maintain our current rate of progress, the 'construction commitment' phase would begin in Q2 2016, subject to funding becoming available from the schools.

## World Challenge: an unexpected journey

The Mwandi Village Project was our last big challenge before R&R and going home, so everyone had built up a sense of excitement and anticipation regarding it. After leaving Chobe, we crossed the border into Zambia on a very busy and shifty old transport ferry, which carried gigantic trucks across the river with an armed guard, and was going to leave regardless of whether everyone stepped on. The drive to the village in a fleet of pink dilapidated taxis was surprisingly relaxing save for the many potholes, and I slept in and out of views of lush trees and grasses sweeping by and school kids walking beside the road.

Mwandi Village was small and interesting, and we stayed on the property of the wonderful Paula. During the days we would leave in the morning at 8 to go to work with Gabbi, our guide for the trip. Gabbi was fluent in English, a brilliant speaker and a very interesting guide who we all liked. Walking off the single main road, we entered a whole other side to the village with wandering dirt paths through family settlements made up of mud huts and grass fences. Building the mud hut itself was hard work but very satisfying; termite-mud clumps were put in a wooden frame to make walls, and then more mud was thrown against the walls to smooth them out. We didn't finish the house but we made a lot of progress towards finishing it. Walking back after work everyone would end up playing with the cheeky village kids, who would ambush us, or come and hold our hands.

The team focused on doubles play in training during the week and were confident of taking the doubles matches. The number one pair was up an early break of serve but struggled to keep up with a

well-drilled pair, going down 3-6 2-6. The number two pair was unable to capitalise on a 4-2 lead in the second set, going down 5-7 6-7. The number three pair



finished their season with seven wins from seven with a 7-6 6-0 victory. In the singles, Richard played an aggressive baseline player and did not perform at his best, going down 5-7 2-6. James won the first set comfortably, however a change of tactics from his opponent turned the match around, the final score being 6-1 1-6 2-6. Daniel was frustrated by a solid baseliner in a 4-6 0-6 loss. Danny played better as his match progressed but his opponent was just a step ahead of him, resulting in a 2-6 4-6 score. 
