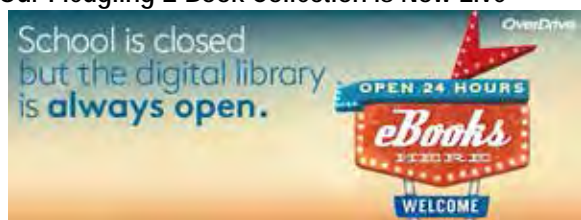

From the Junior Library

Vale Ern Berge Phillips Old Boy /Generous Library Benefactor

Only a few months ago a very valiant, quite sick and very elderly Ern Berge Phillips called in from the town of Gloucester (near the Barrington Tops) to donate his wonderful personal library. Ern's library as with many of our cultured Old Boys Libraries was a treasure trove of biographies of the famous and classic treasures. It is so instructive to see the beloved books of a cultured man which have been collected over a lifetime of reading. We will no longer see this type of book collecting in the digital age. The Ern Berge Phillips Collection is the end of the era of the lifetime book collector. At the time I estimated the worth of this part of Ern's Library at \$9000. This was a considerable donation to our school. Ern passed away on 7 July 2015 after a long battle with melanoma. Ern had represented his school and university as a swimmer and water polo player. Ern was at SBHS during wartime and finished just as the Second World War ended. If any Old Boy knows more about Ern's life please contact our Archivist – **Louise Graul**.

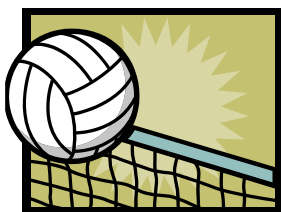

MIC - Football Report

The GPS season has now officially commenced with mixed results over the weekend. SBHS coaching staff were up nice and early to help set up the fields and get the boys prepared for round one of the competition. Our 1st and 2nd XI played against very well organised St Joseph sides and were unable to successfully match them on the field. The 2nd XI played well, but a couple of errors at the back allowed Joeys to convert. We had a couple of chances with Chris Nguyen having a one on one chance with the keeper, but unfortunately the keeper made a good save. The 1st XI was greeted with good news that their skipper, Tom Nimac, was available to play, even with a broken finger. Joeys were a well drilled side and caused a lot of frustration with our players in the centre of the field. Half way through the first half Chris Lee was dangerously challenged by a Joeys player going in for a tackle with studs up. Chris was badly injured and was forced from the field for the remainder of the game while the Joeys player was only cautioned with a yellow card. Marcus Plataniotis was playing hard out in the middle trying to control the situation. This resulted in Marcus being red carded late in the first half leaving the team with just 10 players and our defender off injured. The team still managed to go into half time 0-0. We were rattled and the boys knew they had a difficult task to defend our goal. Joeys took advantage of this and played out wide allowing them space to open up the back defence. Joeys scored two good goals. We managed to peg one back with Jonathan Chew chipping over the goal keeper with his left foot from 30 metres out. This gave us time to try and square it up. Our boys pressed hard, but unfortunately ran out of time.

The 3rd XI played against St Patrick's 2nd XI who is well regarded as a very strong footballing school. They played possibly their best game and to lose 1-2 is a great effort from the team.

In the lower grades we had some success across the age groups especially the U15s and U14s winning four from their six teams. The 15As were too strong for Joeys going up 3-0 very early in the match with Nathan Lebrakis scoring a hat-trick to start the season off strongly. Nathan could have made it four goals but missed a penalty shot. He was outdone by Jason Wang from the 15Es scoring four goals and taking an early lead as the golden boot award for the 2015 GPS Season.

The U16As have been fortunate enough to have our German exchange student, Julian, come into the fold

and has played a huge role in upping the standard of the team. The players are very grateful to have him around.

The U14As score line may not reflect how well they played. Comparing last year where they were out played to this year challenging Joeys throughout the whole match. This goes for all teams; the boys need to make their presence more dominant when we are in their penalty box and try to win the second ball from the headers. The 14bB also showed how much they have improved from losing 7-0 last year to winning 3-0 this year. This is a great sign for our boys proving that training hard does pay off.

Next week we are up against the powerhouse of Newington College. They are a very strong football school and I am sure we are more than capable of challenging them in all grades. Good luck to all our footballers on the weekend and most importantly have fun.

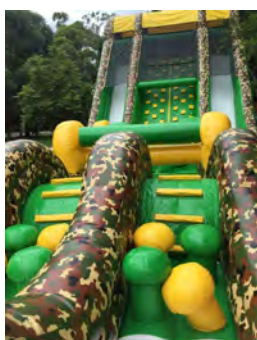
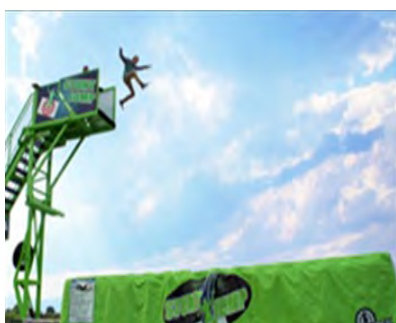
