Tell Them From Me - Survey for Students, Staff and Parents



We have been collaborating with the researchers at The Learning Bar for a couple of years to gather

data about the school from the perspectives of students, parents and staff. We have learned about our school climate, how students feel about having an advocate for them at school and about how high the incidence of engagement with school life is. The surveys have certain shortcomings in the wording of some questions and in the inferences drawn from answers to single questions, but nevertheless the instruments are valuable for the senior management team to inform our planning. This year there is an opportunity for us to ask some of our own questions and add them to the survey. By this means we hope to make the responses we receive more pertinent to the context of High and consequently, more meaningful for school planners.

I commend the surveys to the High school community. An Award Scheme point is on offer as usual for boys who complete the survey. The Partners in Learning Survey can

Year 12 Letter to Parents



All Year 12 parents should have received a copy of a letter from me, dated 5 August. The letter sets out the important

events and dates marking the end of secondary schooling for Year 12 students. Information about reports, references, scholarships and the farewell assembly is included. Our zero tolerance policy on behaviour during the final weeks of school is also explained. If you are a Year 12 parent and you haven't received this letter, please contact the School Office.

Winter Sport Co-payments

All winter sports depend on prompt payment of invoiced co-payments to pay coaches. Parents are reminded that all programs have to meet their budgetary obligations and cannot do so without maximum support from everyone. Our sports are delivered at a fraction of their actual cost, being subsidised by parking revenues and ASF donations, along with the structural support and supervision provided by the school with assistance from the sports levy and general contributions. Please settle up your son's winter sports co-payment now.

Sick Students at School Policy

Many students present to 'sick bay' with a variety of ailments. A School First Aid Officer makes an assessment of their condition. Many injuries are treated on the spot and the cases are managed between the school and parents. If the presented symptoms are serious, an ambulance is called and parents are notified of the School's action and where the student has been taken. If the student just needs time to rest, lounges in 'sick bay' are provided. In the case of sprains and minor injuries, parents are notified and arrangements are made for students to wait until the end of the day or make their way home straight away, if the parents and the School agree and there is someone at home to care for them. There are cases where the student is clearly ill but is not serious enough to be hospitalised, and parents are contacted and asked to come and pick up their son.

Usually, parents find a way to pick up their sons within an hour of being notified. Parents are reminded that the School has no resources to devote to caring for sick students at school if they need constant supervision. The School reserves the right to call an ambulance and have a sick student taken away if parents do not agree to attempt to pick up the sick student within an hour after notification.

More parents – mums OR dads - are needed to sit on the management committee, as a number of parents are finishing this year. Meetings are only for 1 hour – 2.45pm, 2nd Fri each month i.e. 2-3 a term. Parents who work both part and full time have been involved.

Jason Phu (Class of 2006) graduated from the College of Fine Arts UNSW in 2011 with a BFA Honours. He has also studied in Nova Scotia College of Art & Design & Central Academy of Fine Arts, Beijing. He is the winner of this year's Sulman Prize and was also a finalist in this year's Archibald Prize for his portrait of curator Glenn Barkley and in 2014 for his portrait of gallerist Evan Hughes.

Dr Louis Wang (2000) BSc(Med) MBBS MM FRACP is an early-career cardiologist. Louis is the Chief Resident Medical Officer at St Vincent's Hospital and is undertaking doctoral research at the Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute

David Scribner (1983) is the CEO of Virgin Mobile Australia. During his tenure, Virgin Mobile has secured the position of market leader in customer satisfaction and become a leading challenger in the Australian Mobile market.

Since graduating in 1981, **John Croll** has played a leading role in the media industry in Australia. John gained more than two decades of experience at Croll Communications, and Media Monitors before becoming Chief Executive Officer of iSentia (formerly Media Monitors) in 1999.

Allen Liao has been busy since he graduated in the class of 2011. Coming into the game with many missing players due to illness, injury and players being moved up to fill in for 1st grade's injury list, meant that we had to rely on players such as Robert Yuan, Charles Wilson and Liam Elton to step up and fill out our team list. The game started with our introduction to the referee which we thoroughly enjoyed. After a few minutes our first try of the game came from our quick thinking man of the match, Ethan Merrick, who chipped a loose ball into an open field only to use his unmatched speed to out-pace the opposition from 60 metres out and ground the ball over the line.

Our second try came from a No. 8 play off the back of the scrum to Anthony Zhang, who, despite not having the necessary support to complete the play, decided it would be a good idea to run through the defensive line, stepping on four defenders before accelerating, leaving the Scots ¾ line in his dust and putting the ball down just beneath the posts. One of the benefits of SBHS being a part of the GPS system is the opportunity to play away at these magnificent grounds. King's School is enormous is size and spectacular in facilities. As one of my coaches said to me, "Is this its own suburb?"

The 1st XI and 2nd XI played their best match of the season so far. The 2nd XI in the first half had even amount of possession, but created more chances. Kabir Agrawal and Jun Park were combining very well up front with Misha Libman and Bovan Lin in the mid field helping maintain possession allowing the team to push forward and have opportunities at goal. In the second half King's had the majority of possession, but our guys dug deep and never really gave their forwards a chance at goal. A couple of times we were able to counterattack, but their goal keeper had a good game and made some crucial saves. The 2nd XI had their first clean sheet since my time as the MIC of Football.

The 1st XI came out with more intent and belief. They passed the ball around and moved quickly down the sides. Unfortunately King's were able to counter-attack and scored against the run of play to go 1-0 up early in the match. Our boys rallied hard and thanks to a great strike by Chris Nguyen from 18 yards out beating the goal keeper to go into the half 1-1. They continued their positive approach. Again though, King's were able to win possession in dangerous areas and moved quickly down the flanks. Our boys, including the spectators, were waiting for the whistle to be blown for two reasons; he was off side and the ball had actually rolled pass the dead ball line before the King's player chipped it back in field only for King's to catch us off guard and score to take the lead and win the match 2-1. It was a great game and a shame the game had to end in dramatic circumstances.

It was good to see our lower Opens team have success over the weekend. They have been inconsistent with their results so it was nice to see from the 5th-10th XI win their matches. Our 7th and 10th XI teams are two of four teams who remain undefeated. Well done to Joshua King scoring a hat-trick.

The U16s keep showing signs of improvement with all the teams having a narrow loss. Well done Faysal Ayub who has just been moved up to the B team and scoring a goal. The U15s is a very strong age group and have the potential to beat any team. Unfortunately they continually get hit with injuries and rarely have their full strength side. The A team dominated the majority of the match having most of the possession and creating themselves many chances. The two times King's were in our penalty box they came away with a goal.
