Oliver Library System



The staff of our two libraries have been working hard since last October to integrate the new platform for DoE school libraries – Oliver. This replaces the antiquated and clunky Oasis system. There are many administrative improvements built into the new software. The students benefit from a more powerful and integrated research capability. Students are able to use their BYOD devices to access library catalogues and resources. The recent acquisition of a number of e-books for loan heralds the beginning of a new way of thinking about and using libraries. Library services are no longer constrained by library spaces. When we ask your support to help modernise the library equipment, furniture, software and services through our *Student Research and Resources Fund* (which is tax deductible), we are requesting that you re-conceptualise the purpose of our libraries as central places of expertise where individuals can tailor their learning programs to their own needs. Our libraries and our staff can help every single boy to become a more effective learner.

This weekend is our annual highlight contest against Sydney Grammar School. There is something special about this traditional rivalry. On Friday night our first grade debaters take on SGS to decide the premiership and the coveted Louat Shield..

MIC of Football Report

Scots is a good benchmark for us as the majority of our matches are evenly contested. As you can see from the results above, we have now had two weeks in a row with ten or more wins. These are encouraging signs especially with some teams playing against a higher grade. One of the great highlights of the round must go to the U13Es who became the first team in the U13s age group to win a match in my two years as MIC of Football. It was celebrations all around and the boys played extremely well. The U13As played the following match and came out strong taking an early lead thanks to a brilliant strike from Vikas Bolisetty. The boys then conceded two successive goals, but just before half time Kazi Hasan kicked the ball through for himself showing too much pace for the Scots defender. He got himself into a one on one position with the goal to keeper to convert and go into half time 2-2. The boys were on a high and came out in the second half on the attack. Unfortunately another turn over in our red zone allowed Scots to score and eventually win the match 3-2. It was a great game and the U13As are showing a lot of maturity, enthusiasm and eagerness to improve every week. It was great to see the U13Ds continue a successful day for the U13s age group who also got away with a thrilling victory. For an age group that was yet to have any results they finished the day with two wins, two draws and two losses. The age group of the week undoubtedly goes to the U15s who continually prove they are a strong age group winning five and drawing one. This means the U15Es and U15Fs remain undefeated with the U15Ds having only one loss. The U15Cs had a fun day out scoring a season high for SBHS of nine goals.

The most heart breaking draw goes to the U14Cs. Having three losses and two draws for the season they finally had a lead. They scored early in the match and maintained their lead for the whole time until the final kick of the match went into the box and was accidentally handballed by one of our players. Scots were awarded a penalty and were successful in their attempt causing heartbreak for our boys and coach who is yet to have a win in his second season coaching at SBHS. On the opposite end of the scale was our undefeated 15Fs team who were down 1-0 for the majority of the match only to equalise in the final minute causing huge celebrations for the boys knowing they are just one game away from getting their undefeated pennant.

The U16s age group had mixed results, but actually showed improvement on their last outing against Scots. The As and Bs previously lost quite convincingly in their trial match so it was good to see the As narrowly going

down and the Bs winning their first match for the season. The 7th XI virtually have an unsalable lead for the Dolan Cup with another emphatic win scoring five more points for the round. They have been together for two seasons and have lost just the one match. Let's see if they can secure their well-deserved 'undefeated' tag.

The 2nd XI came up against top of the ladder, Scots, who were determined to maintain their top position. Our boys played well and created chances, but were unable to convert. The 1st XI played one of their best games in regards to enthusiasm and passion. They went down early, but the boys fought hard and played with a lot of intent. Our new addition to the team, Finley Hayhurst, has been a great boost for the boys creating more space and control in the centre of the field. Scots defended well preventing us from scoring with them coming away as the eventual winners.

Next week is our final match of the GPS season against our old arch rival, Sydney Grammar. They have plenty of depth in the football program so we need to be on top of our game and finish on a 'High' note. It's important we keep striving to improve and get wins for the back end of the season. This will help us gain belief and momentum when going into 2016. The Schofield boys triumph at The National Cross Country Championships.

During the weekend of the 29-30 August, Jayden and Luke Schofield competed at the National Cross Country Championships in Melbourne, Victoria. This was the second time for Luke, at representing NSW at this level and the first time for his twin brother, Jayden.

Luke and Jayden placed 18th & 33rd respectively in the U18 race (from the younger 16 age group of the 16/17 race). **As 16 year olds, they were 4th & 10th, nationally.** They finished just 24 seconds apart; a minute behind the national champion, highlighting how competitive the race was.

Jayden had a very strong finish, overtaking a few competitors in the last 200 metres of the race and was very happy with his first national event. He didn't leave much in the tank as the photo below shows! The NSW team was dominant with six in the top ten of their race.

On the Monday, a relay was contested, state vs state, to wrap up the weekend of racing. This was followed by an Individual 3km Time Trial - road race. Luke was entered in the time trial and won his age group in a fast time of 9min18sec for the 3.1km course. This is Luke's first Individual medal at a National level and it was GOLD!
