On Friday night last, our first grade GPS debating team made some school history when they defeated a spirited SGS team to become GPS champions and to take away the coveted Louat Shield. It is hard to win all seven rounds in GPS debating. Max Koslowski, Ganesh Chandrasekaran and Thomas Shortridge braved the Grammar 'tunnel' reception of their team, refused to be intimidated by the partisan crowd and the comedy chairperson, and held tight to their proposal 'that the media should not be allowed to report on the mental health of accused criminals'. Our very promising 10A debating team - Akeed Ahamed Ramzi, Louis Saunders, David Wu and Louis Shapiro – were undefeated in the GPS debating season. With Hugh Bartley to come back from second grade GPS, the boys are looking good in the PDC as well.

On Saturday our U16 cross country team ran at the Macquarie University course and won the team's event. They have won every cross country meet of the season and are deserved winners of the GPS Premiership. The telling factor in High's success was its depth. All of our runners contributed even when not earning points because their positions in the field denied points to our opponents. Here is a copy of the speech I gave at the Debating Dinner on Saturday:

Good Evening Dr Jaggar and family, teachers, parents, coaches and most importantly High Debaters. It gives me great pleasure to once again welcome so many of you to our annual dinner which gives us all a wonderful opportunity to celebrate another amazing year of debating for Sydney Boys High and for me to thank each and every one of you for the invaluable support you have given the High Debating Program in 2015.

This year the FED season was very successful and even though we rotated as many students as possible through our teams, we were still able to do very well with Year 7, Year 10 and FED B in the Grand Final. At the end of the day the other schools, with their consistent teams all season, walked away with most of the trophies, but congratulations to Declan and the 10Bs for winning their division.

This year I have been very grateful to Evan Higgins for taking responsibility for the UN and Legal Debating competitions. Our MUNA team reached Nationals again and two of our Dr Evatt teams reached the State Final. Well done to Arthur and Hugh who did very well and to Max and Thomas who actually won the State competition and will, for the second year running, go to Nationals. I will give credit to Arthur Chao for his tenacity, as it is largely through his encouragement that we have seen Legal Debating develop at High. The legal

debaters have made great strides and in particular our Mock trial team has gone from strength to strength. Watching the boys perform at the Supreme Court this week was one of the most awe inspiring activities I have seen school aged students undertake.

Along the way the boys have been ably supported by Lachlan Peake, Christopher Chiam and David Barrow. In addition, they have had an incredible amount of support from Glenn Bartley for which we are all very thankful. All the boys and the adults who have supported them deserve a round of applause and our best wishes as they move into the next round with the remaining 15 other schools.

The Premiers Debating Challenge is still running its course and we have two teams who are in their respective competitions: Year 8 and Year 10. Year 10 will be in the Inter Regional Semi Final next week. Good luck to them as they hopefully continue to the Grand Final. This year we were in an unusual position of having only one Year 12 willing to debate competitively and that is Ganeshmoorthy, our Debating Prefect. who actually deserves a round of applause for that alone, but in addition, I would like to highlight all the hard work he put into organising the Junior House Competition and the Boys v Girls Social Debating Comp. So this year we were in the unusual position of putting forward Max, Thomas and Masrur-ul all in Year 11 to join Ganeshmoorthy in the competition to try and retain the Hume Barbour Trophy for our fourth successive year. Unfortunately, the boys were not lucky on the day, but those of us who attended were very proud of the team getting so far. Well done boys. I would like to thank Ms Barr, Ms Rigby and Ms Cook who have run the PDC Program this year which has really been a huge help to me and a huge benefit to the boys.

This year's GPS season has gone remarkably well. Four out of the seven rounds were almost complete High victories and so in the words of the adjudicators "I think all teams deserve another round of applause." Last night we had two especially nail-biting debates: The 10As and the Firsts. The first time I watched the 10As was when they were in Year 7 and in the last GPS Round at Grammar. I can clearly remember the look on everyone's faces when this very small boy came up and spoke with this very large voice, another one spoke so quickly I thought his tongue might literally fall out and the final one came out with a theatrical performance that was worthy of the STC. This team has had its fair share of bad luck – losing to SGHS in Eastside in two finals and one semi-final; losing to Grammar last year.

So now in the 2015 GPS season Hugh has moved into Seconds and Akeed and Louis Shapiro are joined by David and Louis Saunders. Last night's victory, which meant an undefeated season, was the official recognition of something we already knew – this team is awesome!

The Firsts Grammar-SBHS showdown is always an exciting end to the GPS calendar and on the last two occasions we have been disappointed by the result. This year our Firsts were undefeated and so at the very least we knew we were going to be Co-Premiers, but obviously we are looking to win and keep the Louat Shield outright. The atmosphere last night was electric. Each team was welcomed in through an archway of students singing supportive songs. We had the Aff on the debate "That the media should not report on the mental illness of accused criminals." and with a strong and coherent line, clearly argued through a very cohesive team, we clearly won the debate. Boys stand up and take a bow as the GPS Premiers 2015. Furthermore Thomas Shortridge was part of the NSW Debating team this year. He and Max are in the CHS team in the up and coming Reps Debates and Ganeshmoorthy will be debating for GPS.

A lot of work goes on to ensure the smooth running of Home Debates and this year I have the most wonderful team of helpers led by Benjamin Long who along with Simon Shields, Keiren Mascarenhas and Darren Lim work incredibly hard every home debate and I think they deserve a very special round of applause.

I know that we have the biggest debating program in NSW, but I actually think we have the best as well. When I tell other teachers that we have 250 boys undertaking coaching every Friday afternoon for three terms they simply can't comprehend it. I am proud that our program is inclusive and that every boy who signs up for debating has the opportunity to develop as a debater and to take part in a debate if he wishes. At the core of our program are our coaches and I am continually thankful that such a high number of talented individuals are willing to commit to debating at High. This year Khushaal has ably coordinated Year 7 and coached the As, assisted by Albert who coached the Bs and our newest SBHS entrants: Riley, Lokesh, Jon, Peter and Andrew plus Kendall and Kishor. In Year 8 Julian coordinated and coached the As and Nadirah coached the Bs. We have had a number of Year 8 coaches through this year but Alexi and Nick G have supported the boys to the end. In Year 9 Amelia has coached As and Nicky the Bs. Zafar, Suman and Gabe have coached the rest of the Year 9s and I actually think that

(even in their absence) they deserve a round of applause simply for surviving the year!.

Years 10 have been very lucky to have been coached by the three musketeers of High Debating: Declan, Connor, and Robert. With great organisational skills, amazing coaching ability and impeccable style, Declan has led Year 10 to be the most successful debating year group at High this year and I think he deserves a round of applause. Our Seniors have been very lucky this year to have Christopher coaching the Seconds and Angud coaching the Firsts. After every debate Christopher and his team get into a huddle and there is a blow by blow account of the debate. It is very intense and even when I try to lure them away with offers of supper the post-debate dissection continues. I know that we are particularly lucky to have Angud as our Firsts coach. He is an excellent University debater and a first class coach. Angud lost a challenge I set him this year, but he will be back again next year to secure his victory. Last, but very certainly not least, I want to thank Justin who is our Head Coach. His seamless organisation and his expert knowledge of debating enables me to appear like I know what I am doing on a weekly basis. A big round of applause for Justin and all our coaches.

We are very sad to say goodbye to two coaches this year. Firstly, Ashwin Rudder who was Debating Prefect in 2011 and then came back to coach Year 7s. After his first year I bumped into his parents who told me that Ashwin had found the little ones a bit difficult to handle. The following year Ashwin told me he would be busy with University and wouldn't be able to coach for a while. I thought the Year 7s must have got the better of him and didn't expect to see him again but he returned – this time with a strict new regime including being armed with note books for each of his debaters. Ever since he has been both a flexible and reliable coach, and is a great model for the Old Boys Program at High. Of course, if we only employed Old Boys then our debating program would have missed out on the positive impact that Sarah Greenbaum has had for the last three years. Now, ordinarily I don't employ anyone who has a better taste in fashion and colour than me, but Sarah's overwhelmingly excellent debating credentials won me over. Sarah temporarily left last year to go and study overseas and the surprise party that the then Year 10s organised for her is testament to the fact that she has been more than a coach to many of our boys. I know that working at the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade will be quite a comedown from coaching at High, Sarah, so if you can't stand it anymore our door is always open. We will miss both Ashwin and Sarah and wish them all the best in their future endeavours.

Finally of course I want to thank our parents without whom our program at High would simply not run. Our DSG is very easy going and with only three meetings a year must be one of the least stressful parent bodies to be part of. Thanks to Keith and Elaine for managing the budget again, Victor for being Secretary and Ron for so ably coordinating our Parking events. A special thanks to Dora who has organised absolutely the best suppers on the debating circuit and thank you to all the parents who have helped her prepare the food and clean up at the end of the night. A very big thanks to Glynnis who has, once again, organised such a lovely debating dinner for us, and don't worry, soon I will stop talking so you can enjoy it.

Tonight, we also have a very special thank you to say to Craig Phillis our President who will be stepping down this year because his third son will be finishing at High. I have the sad role of saying goodbye to Craig Phillis who has been an active debating parent for eleven years after his first son started in 2005. All three of Craig's sons: Max, Sam and Nick have been GPS debaters. Max was part of the winning Hume Barbour team in 2010 along with Anthony, Angud and Justin. Craig has been an integral part of debating and has been the President of the Committee in 2007, 2008 and from 2010 until today. This year even though his youngest son wasn't going to be debating Craig agreed to stay on as President because we begged him to! Craig I hope you don't mind if I publically say that I think you have done a wonderful job as a father because you have raised three beautiful boys who are clever, polite and very caring young men. I have absolutely no doubt that each will be very successful in their chosen fields and continue to be role models for their peers. As the MIC of Debating I appreciate the effort you have put in to show support for me and support for the program. On behalf of past and present debaters at High I would like us to raise a glass to thank Craig for all he has done and to wish him all the best for the future.

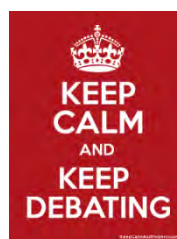
