



From the Principal High Talent

Congratulations to our open cross country team for winning the GPS Premiership. Luke & Jayden Schofield (12R/M), Eric Holstrom (9T) and Nick Katsilis (11T) earned the necessary points in the final run of the season to secure our first win



since 1996. The whole team performed well denying other schools points by securing competitive placings in the events. Great consistency was again shown by our open volleyball teams. First grade defeated SGS in the final round to finish GPS Champions and second grade were undefeated premiers. The Order of Australia Association has recognised several High students for their outstanding community service. Kai Matsumoto (12E) and Andrew McNaughton (12S) received the John Lincoln Community Service Award. James Nguyen (12) Esmond Ye (12M) and Peter Lin (12R) were awarded Certificates of Recognition. It is gratifying to see that our boys are being acknowledged for the great work that they do over multiple years for the community.

Parents Contacting Teachers

We welcome parent-teacher contact about the wellbeing and academic progress of our boys. Teachers can be emailed, telephoned or spoken to in person. However, there are protocols. When teachers are not available telephone messages can be left on voicemail. Teachers may offer mobile numbers to certain parents but others prefer privacy away from work. Teachers' work emails only should be used unless a teacher has made other arrangements with individual parents. Personal interview appointments can be arranged through the School Office. Parents cannot just come to the Front Office and expect to be able to see a particular teacher without an appointment.

Solar Project Commissioned

We have commissioned the installation of a 25KW solar system to be erected by *Solgen* on the McDonald Wing roof. There will be >90

panels of 280w capacity each and an inverter capable of handling 25kw of generation. We have commenced this project early to take advantage of peak power generation in the summer months. Thanks to the generosity of Richard Harding, Elaine Sadler and Keith Shortridge, we have secured nearly half the funds necessary for the project. I am really hoping that parents and Old Boys with an interest in environmental issues, will get behind this initiative and donate enough money to fund the remaining \$14k. Apart from savings in CO2 emissions, the generation will save a considerable amount in electricity costs over the 25-year working life of the new panels. Thank you to James Rudd for his research and negotiation skills to achieve this positive outcome for the school. If you are interested,

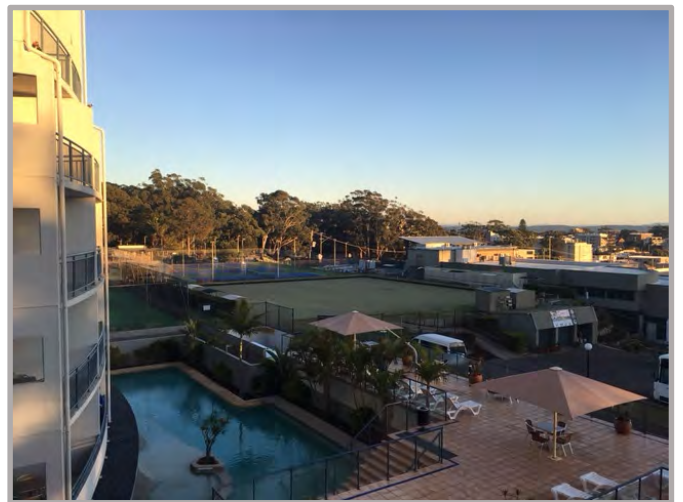
SBHS 2nd Silver at the Stan Jones Cup 2016 Tennis Tournament

Request for Research Participants

In February this year, Dr Jennifer Jolly of UNSW's School of Education presented to a P&C meeting about her research looking at motivation of academically gifted students.

Dr Jolly's presentation is available on the Parent Portal.

Dr Jolly is now seeking participants for her research study investigating *The Influence of Parental Beliefs on Academically Gifted Students' Learning Motivation and Self-Concept*. The aim of this project is to explore the influence of parental beliefs on academically gifted students' learning motivation and self-concept. In this study, mothers will be asked to fill out questionnaires related to the expectations for her child's success in mathematics, science, English, and sport, and assessment of her child's abilities in these same four content areas. Students will be asked to fill out questionnaires related to their self-concept and interest/enjoyment for mathematics, science, English, and sport in order to make direct comparisons of the parental socialization process.

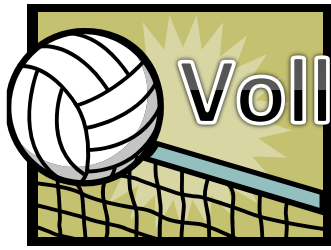

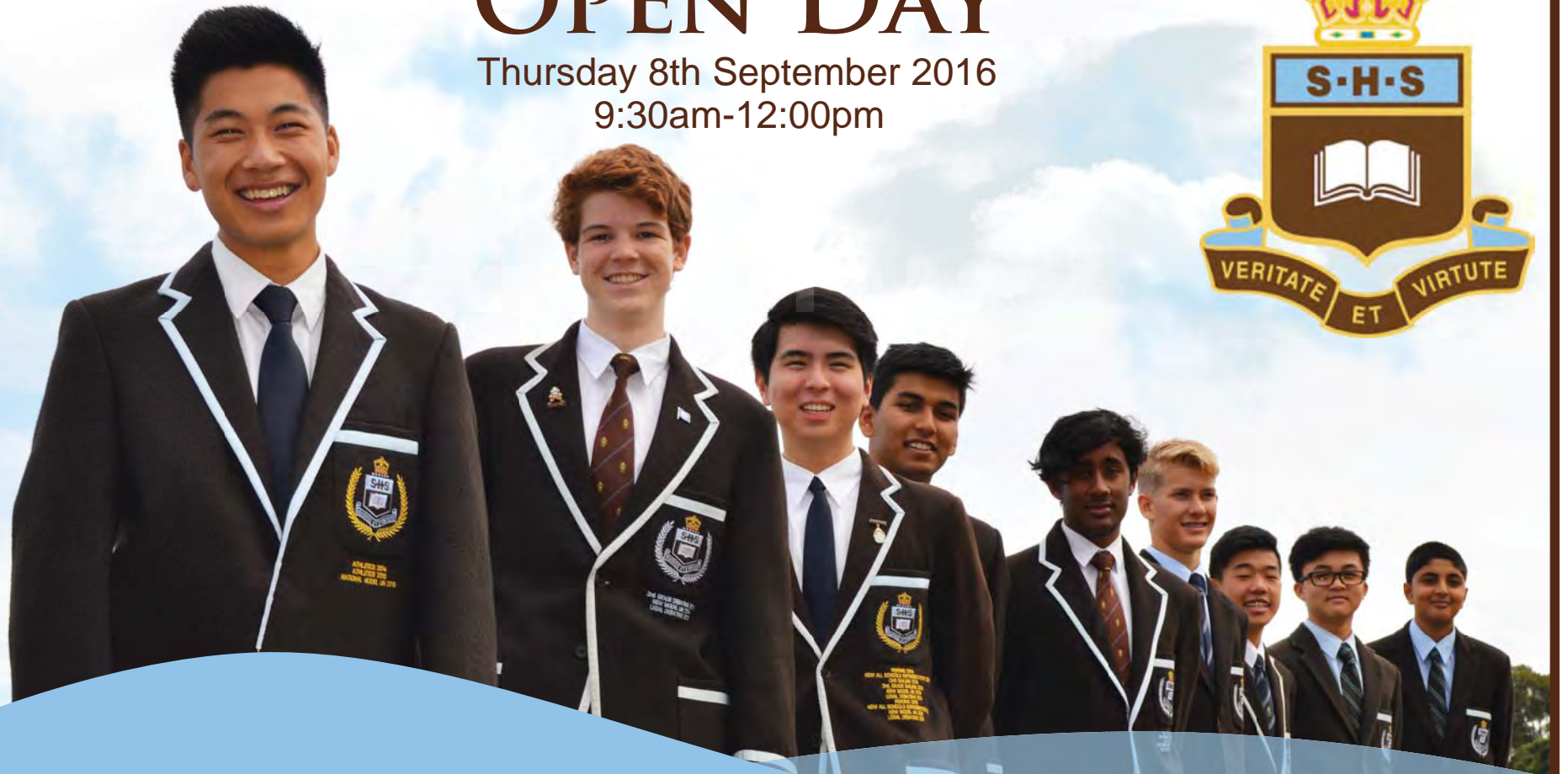
