## From the Principal

Our first basketball team played well together with five or six players making big contributions to a tough win.

## Year 11 Reports

All students in Year 11 should have brought home their reports to discuss with you. It is an important decision point for boys to set up their best ten units to maximise their ATARs. Many
 boys do not have tertiary course plans and should complete 'Career Voyage', our free online career guidance survey, on the student portal and research the 'Careers Website'. Uncertain students and those lacking focus or motivation are advised to seek an appointment with Mr Cipolla, our Careers Adviser, to discuss some big decisions about their future.

## Summer Sport Co-payments: Term 4

The rolls for summer sports and activities have now been finalised. In many activities copayments are levied for the season - in this case Term 42016 and Term 1, 2017. Other sports have a policy of fixing co-payments on a term-by-term basis. In either case, invoices have now been posted. For Years 7-10 this means that the summer invoice will be included on individual Clearance Forms. These will need to be cleared prior to boys receiving their reports. The base co-payment for sport for a season is $\$ 152$ Term 4 2016, as adjusted for $18 \%$ on costs charged by DoE. Higher charges are levied in some expensive sports such as sailing ( $\$ 305$ per term), rowing ( $\$ 535$ juniors / $\$ 555$ seniors), rifle shooting ( $\$ 400$ small bore / $\$ 500$ full bore), archery (\$184), tennis (\$180), water polo (\$200 juniors / $\$ 250$ seniors) and cricket ( $\$ 200$ ). It would help the MICs for these sports greatly if families could pay for their sports in the next ten days.

## Resource Allocation Model Funding 2017

In 2012, the NSW Government announced its Local Schools, Local Decisions (LSLD) reform for NSW public schools. This reform places students at the centre of school decision making. It gives principals and school communities a greater say over how they use the available resources to best meet the needs of their students. To enable the shift of resources to the school level, a Resource Allocation Model (RAM) has been developed. The RAM provides a simpler, fairer and more transparent distribution of government school funding and changes the way resources are managed in our school system. Our RAM funding allocation for 2017 is: a base allocation for staffing ( 93.72 FTE) at $\$ 9,336,176$; school operational funding $\$ 815,380$; staff professional learning $\$ 81,724$; beginning teacher support $\$ 16,323$; minor maintenance $\$ 25,959$; and equity loadings for socioeconomic background, Aboriginal background, English language proficiency and low level adjustment for disability - $\$ 117,217$. Total school RAM funding for next year is \$10,422,779.

## Cars Travelling On School Grounds

Parents and visitors to the school must travel at a safe speed ( $10 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ ) whilst in the school grounds. When
 entering from Cleveland Street by Gate 2 they should park rear to the buildings or tennis courts. Parents and visitors should not use the Anzac Parade entrances. Three-point turns in the bus bay area have posed serious risks to students walking beside the Great Hall and the buses or walking along the path next to the tennis courts and coming down the stairs. The bus bay area is not a drop-off point for students. Parents should drive in gate 1, drop off their sons and drive out gate 2, as per school policy. Please be vigilant in the interests of the safety of our boys!

## From The Junior Library Improving Reading Literacy

The Junior Library has used Oliver (its new library system) reports to analyse its success with improving reading literacy and the following table is the result at examining paper based loans in the Junior School.

English has supported reading literacy for the last $15 y e a r s$. Every junior boy is encouraged to find and read our library books by being brought to the library once every 3 weeks for a full period of reading during English lessons.

While the zero loans figure looks to be a matter of concern it is quite possible at present that these boys are reading e books which were newly introduced last year. E book loans have taken off at a great rate with the Juniors and e books are now responsible for $1 / 3$ of our total library loans. E book loans can be part of our Oliver statistics but I am making a choice at present of encouraging the boys to borrow an e book via the OverDrive and Wheeler's websites as these are more attractive than looking for e books on Oliver. Separate statistics from the two websites have told us the number of borrowers of e books - 1571-but not the names of the boys borrowing.

The message I can take from the paper based loan figures is that well over $60 \%$ of our boys are borrowing our Junior Library books. Of these boys who are borrowing $33 \%$ are borrowing quite well - more than three books so far this year and the year has not ended. The purpose of this analysis was not just to look at Junior Library loans but also to look at the reading habits and behaviour of our selective students. So we looked at how many books each boy was borrowing not just at total loans.

## Junior Library Loans Over a One Year Period

For The Record the library examines several sets of statistics as The Record serves as an historical document recording change in our libraries. So, for one thing, each year we have reported on our loans. For people who do not read The Record I thought I would tell parents and other High Notes readers about our Junior Library's loan record over the past full year.

FICTION - 2687 loans
NON FICTION - 188 loans
E BOOKS - 1571 loans
MAGAZINES - 41 loans
TEXTBOOKS - 824 loans
Altogether there were 5311 loans in the Junior Library. There are 567 borrowers in the Junior School. Senior and Juniors are encouraged to borrow from both libraries but this is an extremely rare occurrence.

## Junior Library Space Proves Its Usefulness

The Junior Library staff keep full /empty statistics for each of the three class size areas in the Junior Library - the Computer Class Area, The Quiet Study Area and the Class Teaching Area. This year the Junior Library was
"in use" for $88 \%$ of class time. A countback of library bookings showed that the Junior Library provided 423 hours of class teaching time over a one-year period. Both the Computer Class Area and the Class Teaching Area had $37 \%$ usage each.

## Websites Can Be Found On Oliver

Before we got Oliver - our web based library system - our librarians regularly put websites vetted by teachers onto OASIS and need to do this again. Three useful websites we will put on immediately are: https:www.grammarly; htttp://childrenlibrary.org and http://vietnamwar.commoration.gov.au
Grammarly is a free site that boys can submit any homework or assignments to and it will check their grammar and spelling and explain grammatical errors. This site is up on Oliver Front Page (Junior Library Branch) if you forget.
The International Children's Digital Library e-publishes significant historical and contemporary childrens' books from various cultural and language groups. Children around the world can access books in their first language, which helps them acknowledge their family heritage.

Australia and the Vietnam War offers a comprehensive range of information and resources related to Australia's role in the Vietnam War. Aspects of the conflict covered include combat personnel, defoliation, conscription, public opinion and the aftermath of the war.

Our library is engaged this very minute in adding catalogued websites vetted by other teachers into the Sydney Boys High Oliver library catalogue. Don't forget you can search the Library's Oliver catalogue at home or school for more suitable teacher and student vetted websites to assist you with assignments.
