Student Awards Scheme - NAPLAN results bonus points

The idea behind NAPLAN is to take snapshots of student learning at regular intervals during their time at school. The results, when analysed, can be used by teachers, students and parents to establish where students are up to in their learning at various points in time and on ways they can improve their outcomes. At High we use this data as encouragement for all boys to try their best in each test to prove to themselves that they are progressing well at school - from Year 5 to Year 7 or from Year 7 to Year 9. They can demonstrate growth. Our internal research has shown a high correlation between NAPLAN reading and writing results and HSC results in courses involving extended writing.

Regrettably, often boys do not treat the tests as seriously as they might – rushing through just to finish early or working carelessly because the results do not count on their reports. They need to take time to check over their work for possible careless errors. We need to convert more Year 7 Band 9 results into Year 9 Band 10 results. Our policy is that we do not teach to the test. Skill development is designed to be included in our subject programming. Each year we adjust our programming to address learning needs



identified from analyses of NAPLAN test results. However, some boys need help refining their skills. There are many suggested activities and resources available on the NAPLAN website to help boys to help themselves to improve their basic skills. Go to <u>www.nap.edu.au/naplan/thetests</u> if you would like to do some preparation or to hone your skills before next year's tests.

Some years ago, we decided to incentivise wholehearted student performances in NAPLAN tests. We offer up to a maximum of 20 Student Award Scheme points for growth in the four tests - 5 points each. Students who maintained their expected growth trajectory received three points and those exceeding it, five. We want to give boys an extra reason to try hard, to progress to the highest levels possible, to use all the available time productively and to check their answers for careless errors or mistakes of logic or judgement. In short, we want to nurture the process of performing to your best ability under pressure. We want to make your growth as a learner visible to you. We see improvement as a collective responsibility for teachers, students, parents and peers.

Invoices for participation in winter sports have been emailed. As usual, we ask for your support by paying them promptly. All of our winter sports depend on a timely settling of invoiced copayments to pay coaches. Parents are reminded that all programs have to meet their budgetary obligations and cannot do so without maximum support from everyone. Our sports are delivered at a fraction of their actual cost. being subsidised by allocations from the school's budget, parking revenues and ASF donations, along with the structural support and supervision provided by the school with assistance from the co-curricular support levy. encourage reading at any time. It is good relaxation away from the demands of academic work. It builds comprehension skills and working vocabulary. It is enjoyable. Parents don't always know what sources of reading that are available. Our Andrews Library (Junior School) has Quick Read Lists. These titles are available for students to read or borrow. Mr Isaacs, our systems administrator, has created a link so that parents can connect with this list and make suggestions to their sons. https://sbhs.co/bwq. Also, our relieving Librarian Mr Love has purchased titles from a list of suggestions from our boys. Given the lasting spotlight on boys' schools cultures, sexual assault and inappropriate behaviour, parents might like to look at a catalogue of wellbeing and *self-help* books and DVDs. Booking interviews with your son's teachers

We use a web based electronic scheduling system for arranging interviews. This produces better results for all participants, especially more compact time schedules for both parents and teachers. The system works as follows:

- By 6pm Friday 17 June, all parents of boys in Years 7 and 11 will be sent details of the scheduling system and a unique code to be entered via email (N.B. Parents of boys in Years 8 and 10 will receive their codes via email at the very end of Term 2).
- This scheduling email will be sent to the address currently held by the school. If you
 have not received this email by the morning of Monday 20 June or if your email
 address has changed from what had been previously advised to the school, you
 should notify the school at office@sbhs.nsw.edu.au. Please indicate your son's name
 and roll class or date of birth so that the information can be forwarded to you.
- On the Edval website you will see your son's teachers listed and you will be able to select those with whom you require an interview (if you hover over a teacher's name, the subject involved will be shown). At the same time, you can indicate your availability between 2:30 pm and 7:30 pm. You should provide this information by 9am on Wednesday 22 June.
- The overall schedule will be generated by the school and your individual schedule should be available for you to download and print from 6pm on Thursday 23 June.
- Periods will be shortened on the days of the interviews. Boys from all years will be dismissed from class at 2:25pm on the dates listed above. The light rail will run to normal schedules and there will be supervision available in the Junior Quad of boys waiting for these services.
- Interviews should not exceed five minutes' duration. If there is insufficient time, a further appointment may be arranged for a later date.

Similar arrangements will be in place for Years 8 and 10 interviews on Tuesday 26 July.

Year 7 Camp Reports



Year 7 finally made it to Camp!!! After the trials of COVID, the Outdoor Education Program kicked off with a bang! A big thank you to the staff who accompanied the boys, without their help, camps wouldn't be able to go ahead. Ove the coming weeks I will be including a few reports written by students about their experience.

This year's annual Year 7 camp was much awaited by all of Year 7 due to it being unfortunately cancelled earlier this year. Taking place at Broken Bay Sport and Recreation Centre, some boys were especially eager to depart considering it would be their first camp due to the effects of Covid. We spent three days at the camp, departing on the 6th and returning on the 8th of June. Each day held a myriad of physical, teambuilding and thought-provoking activities, promoting and edifying positive qualities throughout our cohort.

Early on Monday morning, students left on a bus to undertake a 90-minute drive and ferry ride to the venue. The bus ride was fairly quiet as many boys were still waking up, but the ferry ride was lively with the boys feeling the excitement emanate.

Upon arrival, the boys were in awe of the facilities and ravishing landscapes on offer. The camp was situated at the mouth of the prepossessing, Hawkesbury River, providing all attendees with a picturesque view of the rugged bush and the idyllic beach. Boys were probably most excited about cabins. Attendees were assorted into six separate cabins with 20 boys in each cabin.

Over the course of two days, the boys partook in several activities, each testing them in different ways. Through these activities students simultaneously developed cooperation, perseverance and navigational skills. One activity that the boys particularly enjoyed was the Bushwalk. Students were taken up through the bush, trekking through much foliage, displaced rocks and protruding tree roots. Once at the top, the boys were taught and asked to make a campfire in small groups. Students used twigs, sticks and branches found at the site to erect a natural campfire. All groups were successful in building and lighting a fire, a skill that may come handy in the future. Following this, students made damper (a type of bread made from a wheat-based dough) using a premade batch, above a campfire. All the boys absolutely loved this experience, as for many of them, it was their first time building and using a campfire.

On the final day of camp, all attendees participated in a major team building activity which was based on all the skills they had assimilated over the duration of the camp. Students were divided into teams of roughly eight and were to go around the camp, completing a variety of different activities. To make it more enticing, the teams were competing against each other and with a time limit. This activity was convivial for all attendees and permitted everyone to demonstrate the knowledge they had acquired over their time at the camp.

Overall, the Year 7 camp was a great escapade for all students, providing attendees with a pleasurable experience and a well-deserved break from the academic demands of high school. A big thank you to Ms lbbott for her meticulous planning of this camp, the venue for hosting us and all the supervisors who accompanied the students, taking time out of their own time to see us having a good time. **Ryan Mather (7E)**

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2022 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEAR	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV)	2 doses at least 6 months apart
rear /	Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough (dTpa)	1 dose
Year 10	Meningococcal ACWY (MenACWY)	1 dose

Our 2022 school vaccination clinic dates are scheduled as follows:

Visit 2 – Year 10 (Meningococcal ACWY) and Year 7 & 8 catch-up 23rd of June 2022

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- Read all the information provided
- Complete all fields on the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s you would like your child to receive
- Return the completed consent form to your child's school
- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic

Please note that, to improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered catch-up vaccination for any missed doses, including:

- during Year 8 (for HPV and dTpa vaccination) and during Year 11(for Meningococcal ACWY vaccination) for consent signed in 2021
- during Year 9 or Year 12 to students in Years 9 and 12 (who were in Years 7 and 10 respectively in 2020) who missed vaccination during 2020 and 2021 due to COVID-19 disruptions. PHUs will minimise school disruptions by offering extended catch-up vaccination during routine Year 7 and 10 clinics.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing or by phoning the school. More information is available at: www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form. Details about vaccinations given at school will also be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to support complete vaccination histories.

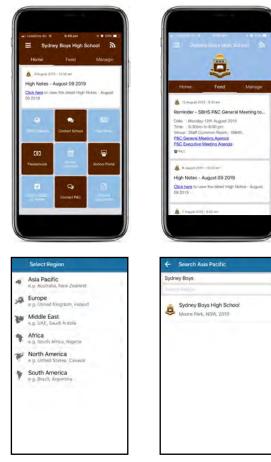



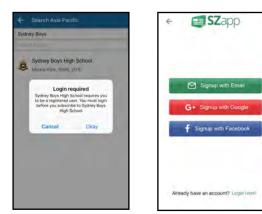
