Congratulations to our undefeated Opens Basketball Team on their dominant win in the state final of the CHS Schools Knockout



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Interpreting Year 11 Reports- Semester One

All Year 11 students should have their reports. Parents should be aware that the information upon which the first semester report marks are based, might be a measure of just one or two skill sets or a limited number of completed topics, or just one task, and thus a proportionately fewer number of marks. These marks are extrapolated to produce a mark out of 100 or 50 per unit. In some cases, where students have missed the only task set, a blank or N/A might appear against the student's name for a course on the report. Individual marks for courses supplied by teachers are recorded and run against an ATAR predictor program. All the raw marks are converted into scaled marks per unit. Students missing a mark for a course will be given the score of the average of their other course scores for ATAR calculation purposes. In the iterative scaling process, students' marks in one course are compared against all the other students who completed the same course and against their performances in their other courses. The data we use are last year's HSC results for High. We shape current data, in terms of means and standard deviations, against the previous year's actual HSC data. The essential comparative assumption is that students, as a cohort, will perform at or around the same standard this year, as they did last year. This process can skew results (positively or negatively) if students miss tasks in several courses. Of course, individual courses have better or worse results on any given year, but overall, the predictor yields ATAR 'guesses' that are usually reliable to the +/- 1 level. A scaled score out of 50 is calculated for each course on a one-unit basis. English and Mathematics Extension courses are given a scaled mark out of 150. In English, the relative contributions of Advanced and Extension can be distorted if a wide discrepancy exists in performance in each course. Accuracy improves in Year 12 when only 10 units are considered for the ATAR calculation Any student studying a course outside the school is given the average per unit of their other courses, instead of missing the values altogether. Students good at PE may be negatively affected with PE removed from the overall calculation of performance.



Booking interviews with your son's teachers

We use a web based electronic scheduling system for arranging interviews. This produces better results for all participants, especially more compact time schedules for both parents and teachers. The system works as follows:

- By 6pm Tuesday 28 June, all parents of boys in Years 8 and 10 will be sent details of the scheduling system and a unique code to be entered via email.
- This scheduling email will be sent to the address currently held by the school. If you have not received this email by the morning of Wednesday 29 June or if your email address has changed from what had been previously advised to the school, you should notify the school at <u>office@sbhs.nsw.edu.au</u>. Please indicate your son's name and roll class or date of birth so that the information can be forwarded to you.
- On the Edval website you will see your son's teachers listed and you will be able to select those with whom you require an interview (if you hover over a teacher's name, the subject involved will be shown). At the same time, you can indicate your availability between 2:30pm and 7:30pm. You should provide this information by 9am on Wednesday 20 July (the first week of Term 3).
- The overall schedule will be generated by the school and your individual schedule should be available for you to download and print from 6pm on Thursday 21 July.
- Periods will be shortened on the days of the interviews. Boys from all years will be dismissed from class at 2:25pm on the day. The light rail will run to normal schedules and there will be supervision available in the Junior Quad of boys waiting for these services.
- Interviews should not exceed five minutes' duration. If there is insufficient time, a further appointment may be arranged for a later date.

OVERDUE BOOKS

As we are coming up to the end of term, I am making sure that all overdue books for Junior students are returned or

renewed. Students can borrow up to 10 books for one month and can renew those books for a further month. If they wish to keep books longer, they can bring them in to the library, and we can return and reissue books for another month. The date is stamped in the back of the book, so students can easily see when a book is due back.

English textbooks are also lent through the library system, and when students have finished studying that book in class, it's time to return the book.


I am finding students who have overdue books from last term, or even last year. This means that those books are not available for other students to borrow. I have given students in years 7, 8 and 9 overdue notices, and expect that they will return books they have finished or renew items they are still reading. The overdue slip also has the replacement cost of the book, and if students have not returned or renewed these books by the end of Week 9, I will be issuing invoices, and the price of the books will be added to student's school fee statements.

There is a significant cost in replacing lost books, especially for the English department, which has to replace lost textbooks so students the following year can use those texts. This is a burden for school staff who have to follow up on overdue books, issue invoices, clear those costs when boys pay the invoice or return the book, or order and process replacement items. A better solution is for students to look around at home, find the overdue books, and return them as quickly as possible (and maybe borrow some more books for the upcoming vacation, which they will hopefully return on time next term!).

Students can check their borrower records from the Library homepage. When they are logged in, they can click on their name in the top right hand corner:



If they then click on Loans, all the items on their record will be displayed. They can renew items if they are coming up to, or even past the due-by-date, but only the once.



I will be checking for overdue books at the end of every term, and hopefully next term we'll see a reduction in the number of students with overdues!

And just a reminder that the Lionel Bowen Young Writers' Award is on again this year, and the closing date for entries is August 31. Students can enter poems or short stories and have the chance to win cash prizes. A great opportunity for students to work on their writing skills. **Dr Love**,

Saturday 18/05/2022:

Australian Schools Intermediate Fencing Championships – Foil Events:

Last Saturday, SBHS competed in the National Intermediate Schools Competition, putting one Foil team into the Competition consisting of Lyndon Chow(8E), Daniel Kim(9M), Benjamin Pham(8R), and Joshua Wang(9E). These fencers also entered the Individual Competition with Benjamin coming in 5th place, Joshua in 7th place, Daniel in 10th place, and Lyndon in 27th place. Our fencers competed against other schools including Sydney Grammar, Newington College, Brisbane Grammar, Knox Grammar, and the University High School in Victoria. Benjamin dominated in his pools with an overall rank of fourth, giving him a bye straight to the top 16 in direct eliminations, where he then beat his opponent 15-4 for a spot in the top 8. Sadly, in his bout to the top 4, he was beaten 15-3, and achieved a final rank of 5th. Daniel and Joshua's bouts to the top 16 were both easy wins with the scores being 14-8 and 15-7 respectively. Unfortunately, in the direct elimination bout for top 8, Daniel and Joshua were placed against each other, with Joshua winning 15-6. Joshua then unfortunately lost a very close bout 10-12, for the top 4 spot, which put Joshua in final rank of 7th place. Lyndon was knocked out in the first round of direct eliminations losing 15-3. In the team bouts, SBHS faced off against BGS (Brisbane Grammar School) and won 45-39 to secure a spot in the finals. The team unfortunately lost against SGS A (Sydney Grammar School A) with a score of 28-45 and finished 2nd to win a silver medal. Thanks to the parents for driving and accommodating our fencers, as well as Coach Kevin and Mr Huynh for providing insight and coaching to our fencers. In the team competition, our Epee team won Gold, beating Newington College. In the individuals, Tommy won Gold, Xavier and Kelvin tied Bronze.

It was a very special experience. We drove to Canberra on Saturday with our parents (thank you) and stayed overnight, ready for the early start on Sunday. Fortunately, we mostly passed the weapons check. The epee individual final was an epic match, Tommy Xu vs Richard Windsor, who is a challenging opponent in our age group. Tommy and Richard tied 9-9 when Richard called for passivity with 7 seconds remaining. Since they had tied scores, both were to receive yellow cards. 




