Firstly, I'm very pleased to say that there are a large number of individual feats to report on this week.

High Talent

Congratulations to Oscar Shi (10S) for his outstanding results in the 2022 Commonwealth Fencing Championships in London this week. Oscar won the individual Cadet U17 Men's Sabre, defeating his British opponent 15-12 in the final bout. In doing so, he won the first ever gold medal in the men's sabre by the Australian Team in the Commonwealth Fencing Championship. Furthermore, in the team division he won the bronze medal in both the Men's Junior U20 Sabre Championship and Men's Cadet U17 Sabre Championship Teams. Well done Oscar on such an incredible and historic achievement!







In other fencing news, Henry Lin (10S) came equal 3rd with the bronze medal in the NSWSFL U16 Foil Individual Competition held at Riverview last week. Well done Henry on a great result!



Isaac Ayoubi (12F) continues to excel in basketball. This week he competed in the NSW All Schools team, completing an undefeated run to win gold at Nationals. He has also been selected as part of the All Australian


performances in the Sydney Opera House at both the *NSW State Festival of Instrumental Music* and *In Concert*. We look forward to hearing more about your experience Jiazi.

Workshops

In preparation for their shift into Year 12, all Year 11 students will be attending note taking workshops in the last week of this term. Students will become familiar with different methods of notetaking and learn about the importance of taking and reviewing their notes that they take in class.

Fiction

Students have access to thousands of hardcopy books (fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, study guides, manga), online eBooks and audiobooks through our Sora and Wheelers subscriptions and other materials such as magazines and journals.

The physical collection is currently being overhauled, with many of the outdated books going, so that the shelves are a lot easier to browse.


