# SPEECH NIGHT and 110th ANNUAL PRIZE-GIVING

Tuesday, 1st March, 1994

Occasional Address by Mr John Wickham, BA DipEd (WA), BEd (NE) Headmaster, The Kings School

# **Principal's Address**

t is with great pleasure that I add my personal welcome to our Guest of Honour Mr Jon Wickham, Headmaster of The King's School and to Mrs Wickham. Mr Wickham is an educational leader who has a clear personal vision of what his school should be trying to do and a strong personal determination to make it happen. Whatever judgment history comes to make on the Wickham era at King's, I am certain that it will be most favourable and will acknowledge that his philosophy of education was the correct one for the times. Whatever else his school is respected for – and there are many reasons to respect The King's School one has to acknowledge its commitment to the arts under Jon Wickham. I have little doubt that King's is the leading school in theatre arts in this state and quite probably in this country, thanks to Jon's foresight. I suggest to all of you that you consider attending a performance in The King's Theatre. You will be stunned at the quality of the productions. Education at King's is being redefined. What happens in The King's Theatre is part of that redefinition. What happens in The King's Theatre is education in the fullest and richest sense of the word.

Having mentioned theatre, I should add that King's are not bad at a few other things, either, such as rowing and rifle shooting and academic endeavour. King's win in the 1993 Head of the River was equal to the finest sporting achievement that I have witnessed in a lifetime of watching sport.

I welcome also Mr Donald Goodsir, Director of Schools for Woollahra, and Mrs Goodsir. As always, Mr Goodsir, you are most welcome at the school. You have an awareness of the unique character of this school and a good understanding of the way the school community functions. Your continuing support of the school's endeavours is much appreciated. I welcome the heads of the organisations of the School Family of Sydney High School: Mr Phillip Lambert, Chairman of the School Council and Mrs Lambert; Mr Phillip Whyte, President of the P&C and Mrs Whyte; Mr Robert Mitchell, Chairman of the Sydney High School Foundation, and Mrs Mitchell; and Mr Ken Baret, President of The High Club and Mrs Baret. I have to hand an apology from Major-General Jim Norrie, President of the Old Boys' Union and Mrs Norrie. General Norrie has had a long-standing engagement to celebrate the birthday of the Australian Army. He sends his best wishes.

A special welcome to two past Headmasters of the school, Mr Ken Andrews and Mr Bob Outterside. Your attendance tonight, gentlemen, is most appreciated.

I can report a very successful year for Sydney High School in 1993. The Class of 93 achieved well academically and twenty-eight of them gained a position within the top thousand in the state. The great majority came within the top 30% of the state.

- Ron Granot was 1st in 3 Unit French and achieved a score of 100 in his HSC.
- Fabian Huppauf was 1st in 3 Unit German
- Brian David was 1st in 3 Unit Hebrew
- John Yang was 1st in 2 Unit Classical Greek
- Timothy Smythe was 2nd in 3 Unit Classical Greek
- Corin Bone was 2nd in 2 Unit Course 1 Music
- Ron Granot was 3rd in 4 Unit Mathematics and 8th in the Australian Mathematics Competition, Senior Division
- David Poynting and Adrian See were equal 3rd in 2 Unit Industrial Technology
- Joshua Kaye was 3rd in 3 Unit Classical Greek
- Timothy Smythe was 4th in 3 Unit Latin
- Ron Granot was equal 4th in 2 Unit Chemistry
- · David Wong was 6th in 3 Unit Business Studies
- Lenny Roth was 6th in 2 Unit Economics

Our Year 10 debating team of Jeremy Heimans, Cameron McKnight, Emil Stern and James Slezak won the state championship.

Cameron McKnight won an essay writing competition run by the Australian Historical Society.

Christopher Rodley, then of Year 10, was adjudged the ICI Young Playwright of the Year and his play was given a dramatised reading by the company at The Wharf Theatre. The play is shortly to be produced by the Australian Youth Theatre. In the same competition Andrew Ivanov and Emil Stern also achieved placings.

In Music, Matthew Cate represented NSW as a member of the Talent Development Project, a group of outstanding young performers who receive intensive tutoring from top names in show business. Gregory Flynn was successful in his application to attend the National Music Camp. Jonathan Corea, even now only in Year 10, worked as Assistant Musical Director in a professional production of *Amadeus*.

In Visual Arts seven boys had their works held back for possible inclusion in *Artexpress* and three boys – David Chapman, Bearin Houghton and Scott Arbib – were successful in having their works included in this prestigious exhibition of the best HSC art works.

Three students – David Chapman, Adrian See and David Poynting – had their major works held back for possible inclusion in the prestigious *Intech* exhibition of Industrial Technology major works.

The First Grade Soccer team won the GPS Premiership and the Independent Schools Cup and reached the semi-finals of the Commonwealth Bank Cup. Eight boys were selected in the Combined Independent Schools side and eight in the Combined GPS side.

The First Grade Cricket team won the Five Highs Carnival in Adelaide and competed successfully against Melbourne High for the Cec Rubie Trophy.

In water polo, Ryan Moar achieved CHS selection and Australian Under 20 selection.

In basketball, our First Grade won both the Raschke Cup and the Knox Invitation Tournament. They are undefeated in the 1994 competition.

Our 1st VIII won the School 1st VIII at the Riverview Gold Cup regatta.

In rugby, we had nine GPS representatives. Seven were selected to play for NSW (Caerl Murray, Jason Jones-Hughes, Mark Stcherbina, Sam Taumoepeau, Luke Mann, Clinton Allardice and Matthew McKay). Three were selected to represent Australia (Caerl Murray, Mark Stcherbina and Luke Mann). Our First XV came a most creditable second in the GPS competition.

Let me turn now to another success story within the school: our tutor programs. The part time employment of Mr Stephen Jubb to supplement the work of the Music staff has been an unqualified success and is continuing this year. Mr Neil Whitfield is employed on a casual basis to run workshops for our very talented writers. By the middle of this year we should have at least thirty boys participating in talented writers programs. There are other programs in Visual Arts. These additional programs come at no additional expense to the boys' families. Talented musicians and writers and artists gain the benefit of specialised tuition at no expense additional to their school fees.

I can report that the Development Application for the UTS Union/Sydney High School Sports Centre went through council last night and construction should begin soon. It has always been our intention that the Girls' School should have access this important new facility. There should be announcements soon about other interesting enhancements of the school's sporting facilities, possibly not far from the school fence.

Relationships between this school and UTS have strengthened during the year, as have the links with the University of NSW where Professor John Niland, an ex student of my old school, Lismore High, is the Vice-Chancellor. It is important that an academically selective school should develop and sustain good relationships with tertiary institutions.

Our next major building project should be the one that the parent group has spoken strongly in favour of – a Senior Study Centre. We have a ready made site on top of the McDonald Wing that will give us 485 square metres of floor space, enough to fit half the senior school. We will need to make a detailed submission to the Minister through the Department of School Education by about 1 May this year if we hope to gain approval for the 1994-1995 financial year. We will need to put up about \$250,000 and to seek matching funding. I am pleased to report that the preparatory work for this project is on schedule.

The rationale for the study centre is as follows: a selective school is primarily about academic pursuit. Academic work involves *reflection*. We have recognised the need to give our boys a *place* to reflect. They have a *reason* to reflect because they want success at the HSC. They will have more things *to reflect on* as we continue to increase spend-

ing on information resources. They will increasingly gain *time to reflect* as teaching methods inevitably become more flexible. It will not be long before even Year 7 boys will have access to sources of information currently available only to some academics.

The school continues to monitor developments in technology and to assess their potential impact on teaching and learning. We hope soon to be part of Telecom's fibre optic cable trial in the Centennial Park area.

I give a special thank you to the staff, teaching and administrative. I thank also the elements of the School Family who have continued to support the school and to safeguard its interests. I thank the parents for their support and their loyalty to the school. And I thank the boys, a wonderful and talented and diverse lot whose courtesy and good humour are a constant source of reassurance.

Let me conclude by giving you an instance of what it's all about at Sydney High.

Last Sunday our rifle shooting committee ran a Sydney High Shoot at Malabar. Seventy-one shooters entered from rifle clubs all over. The day was highly successful and raised \$1500 towards the cost of sending our team to Bisley in June. The team itself did not compete because they had to mark targets all day. They were assisted, however, by a number of Year 7 boys who have been at the school for only a few weeks. These young fellows worked hard all day without complaint. They were very tired by four o'clock. They were as good natured and as good spirited at the end of the day as they had been at the beginning of the day. The job was there to be done and they did it willingly and cheerfully and thereby provided all of us with a splendid example.

I must mention in passing that the school's rifle shooting day enjoyed the attendance of Mr John Jobling MLC, an Old Boy and Mr Lloyd Coleman MLC, an Old Boy of King's. Indeed, Mr Coleman's support was so strong that he was accused of switching his allegiance. He remarked to me that he would prefer that the matter did not reach the ears of Mr Wickham. "He'd be a fine one to tell", I replied, "he's the guest of honour at the Sydney High speech night next week!"

We at Sydney High School face a challenging and exciting and demanding year in 1994. There is a role for all of us and we will all share in the challenge and the excitement and the demands. There is a strong momentum building that should see us achieve all the things that we want to achieve.

For motivation and example we need only think of those fine young men of Year 7 who were marking targets last Sunday, so early in their time at High. The future of the school is assured while young men of that calibre are picking up its tradition. We must do the best we can for them.

# Prefects' Induction Principal's Address

r Gainford put it to me a few weeks back that we needed to arrange a guest speaker for today's ceremony and I put my mind to thinking of someone who might be invited. Then it occurred to me that other people were having all the fun and that it was time for me to do something as significant as to present the badges of office to the incoming School Prefects and their executive. So here I am. And I am very proud to be here.

I want to draw a parallel between my role and that of Prefect and Prefect Executive. I have always believed that the true leadership role of the Head of a School should be that of a'Leader of Leaders'. A school's success is to a significant extent a function of the efforts of the staff, individually and collectively. The Principal's role is generally and inevitably a public role. The roles of the teachers and ancillary staff are frequently not so public.

To the Prefects and their Executive and to the whole school I say, you are surrounded by examples of excellence in leadership among the staff of the school. It is frequently neither public nor publicised, but it is leadership that provides you with a splendid example. Let me illustrate. Please do not take this as a definitive list.

Mrs Cripps, our Head Clerical Assistant, is presiding over the introduction of a computer system that will enable the school to manage its finances with great efficiency. It will be one of the milestones in the history of the school. Mrs Cripps' leadership is characterised, as always, by determination, patience and quiet persuasion.

Mr Patterson, our General Assistant, has done an amazing amount of good for the school in his short time here. His good nature, his commitment to hard work, his unfailing goodwill are a fine example to you all. In his unassuming way, he is a leader whose demeanour you would do well to note. I ask that you insist that the boys support his concern for the school environment. He is determined to make the school an environmental showpiece.

Mr Hutcheson has played a leadership role in the successful introduction of Business Studies and Computer Studies into the Senior School. With Mr Woolnough and other members of the school's Computer Committee, he is presiding over a three year program of computer purchasing, likely to be nearly half a million dollars by the end of 1995, that will make Sydney Boys' High School a national leader in computer education. These people are true leaders. The Computer Committee are visionary and they are also prepared to do the hard work to make their vision a reality.

I commend to you the leadership in teaching of Mr Van Opstal. His dedication to the task, his insistence on the highest standards of scholarship in Mathematics, are a daily example of excellence that you would do well to emulate.

Mr Walker, Ms Hardy, Ms McKellar-White, Mr Balos, Ms Zersvadze, Ms Tuthill, Mr Hassall, Mr Jubb, Mr Coan provided a magnificent example of educational leadership in their production of Kiss Me, Kate. It was a lovely combined effort by students, staff and parents.

Mr Judge has made an immediate impact on the musical and sporting life of the school. His recent organisation of a school band tour to the South Coast provided the musicians and their audiences with wonderful and memorable opportunities. A good school is all about opportunities for its members.

Mr Selway deserves recognition for his leadership in debating. His Year 10 team, as I speak, is contesting the state final of the Commonwealth Bank Cup. It may or may not be possible for the result to be announced before the end of this assembly.

Mr Watson deserves mention for his excellent example in cricket. You should look also at his superb photographs near the Mathematics staffroom. Mr Watson was an exhibitor at the School's Art & Craft Show last weekend and I took pleasure in acquiring two of his photographs for the school's art collection.

Ms Swaddling deserves special mention for her leadership role as an Advanced Skills Teacher. She has the particular role of study skills programs and her work so far has been characterised by thoroughness and professional expertise.

Ms Barda has taken over the role of Year Adviser in Year 11. She took it upon herself to organise the farewell luncheon for Year 12, an event which was both dignified and enjoyable. Mr Boros has done a first class job as Year Adviser for Year 12. And so on. I repeat that I could go on for a long time about the wonderful leadership shown by members of staff. Let me draw some conclusions from the things I have mentioned.

First, as Prefects you have been acknowledged as leaders. I would urge you, however, to consider yourselves as leaders of leaders. Just as there are many examples of leadership among the staff, there are many examples of leadership among the boys of the school. Look for the leadership examples and acknowledge them. Let the boys know that you know what's going on in the school.

Secondly, the examples of staff leadership that I have given you are characterised by humility and unselfishness. You would do well to note that most achievers are quiet achievers.

Thirdly, the school is a better place for their contribution. I urge you to take a similar approach. The school is a product of its history. You owe a lot to people who have gone before. You have an obligation to make a contribution while you are here. You should aim to make the school a better place.

Fourthly, the quiet achievers I have mentioned have provided rich and varied opportunities for other people. The effectiveness of a school can be judged in large part by the opportunities it provides for its members. I urge you all, in your leadership role, to look for ways in which you can provide opportunities for your fellow students. This can be something as simple as taking the time to talk with younger students, individually or in groups, about anything at all. Just the fact of your talking to them will give them an opportunity to be acknowledged by one of their leaders. What you do, how you conduct yourselves, will be noticed by them.

Not everything you do will be popular. Leadership based on popularity alone will soon be recognised as superficial and third rate. Good leadership has to be firm but it has also to be fair and reasonable. Students will accept your judgment if you are fair and reasonable in your dealings with them. If you try to be domineering, you will lose their respect and your credibility will disappear.

You have my strong support. I look forward to regular meetings with your executive: David Eyers, Evan Jones and Travis Dunn. I am sure they will keep me honest. I, in turn, will try to ensure that they earn their money, so to speak. Life as a Prefect of Sydney High School is surely not meant to be easy.

Mr Baldock has asked me to assure you of his strong backing. I welcome Mr Baldock's expression of support and I repeat my gratitude for the example of strong and purposeful leadership that he himself has given. I urge you to seek his advice and counsel.

You are a fine group of young men, well worthy of the confidence that the school has shown in you. Your families can feel justifiably proud of you.

On behalf of the School Family, I congratulate you and wish you well in your leadership role.

Meanwhile, at the University of New South Wales, Yaron Finkelstein (also 1988) has been elected Editor for 1993 of the counterpart publication, "Tharunka".
- **Higher Studies** Adam Magro, recent Captain of the School, and Ben Lexsen Scholarship winner, has won a place at the Institute of Sport in Rugby football.
- Federal Scholars The Federal Minister for Education was pleased to award five hundred prizes this year, each worth \$2000, to high school leavers throughout Australia. Amongst the one hundred and forty-eight recipients in New South

Wales were Anthony Abrahams, Shee-Chuen Chen, Tony Cheng, Steven Gan, Tamir Maltz, and Tommy Ng.

- In The Limelight Rising young playwright Mark Swivel (Year 12 1983) was interviewed on the 2BL Breakfast program on 3rd June about the opening that week of his play "Gulf" (a comedy of the nineties) at the Bondi Pavilion for a three week run.
- **On The Ball** In late May Richard Ball (Year 12 1991) was selected in the NSW Under 19 Rugby Team, and Adam Magro (Year 12 1988) was named in the Sydney Under 21 Team.
- War And Peace In Mid-April the second large contingent of Australian soldiers to join the United Nations Peace Keeping Force in Cambodia included Lieutenant Robert Gunn (Year 12 1988), former Cadet Under Officer in the High Cadet Unit, now serving in the Signal Corps.
- London Blues James Holbeck, recently awarded a rare CHS Rugby Blue, toured the UK with the CHS First XV during December. His selection for CHS was possible due to his age making him just eleven days too old to play for the School in GPS competition.

# **School Notes 1993**

- **Numbers Man** The School's new Deputy, Mr Wayne Baldock, reports that this year 71.1 members of staff ministered to 1069 boys. This is a ratio of 15.035 boys per teacher.
- Big And Wet Sydney High, CIS, CHS, and State Schoolboys Waterpolo representative Ryan Maor, whilst still in Year 12, has been selected in Sydney University First Grade, and is playing in the National League. This involves regular trips to away games in other capitals.
- Old Boys I In April Andrew Black (1988) graduated from the University of New South Wales with First Class Honours in Chemistry. He will

be taking up a scholarship to undertake a PhD at Harvard.

**Gone For Good** - Whilst many rooms have changed their usage over the years, the former box office, known to many as the dog-box, situated in the foyer near the Deputy's office, has perhaps had the most chequered career. Recently it served as possibly the smallest clinic in the world, but this year it was decided that its presence merely encouraged malingerers, and so it was summarily demolished, greatly improving the appearance of that part of the building.

- **Soon To Return?** Also gone from the room-list is the prefects' room, taken over as a classroom last year, and this year turned into a new and improved High Store. The prefects now meet in the bottom of the stairwell near Room 1, but it is hoped that after the refurbishments currently under way some slightly more salubrious accommodation can be found.
- Victim Of Progress The language laboratory, once the envy of less fortunate schools, was dismantled this year, apparently no longer considered necessary in the teaching of LOTE (Languages other than English).
- Spectacular Success One of the star performers at this year's Schools Spectacular was guitarist Matthew Cate, who had earlier represented NSW schools at the ARTEXPRESS Exhibition in San Francisco, which marked the 25th anniversary of the sister-city relationship linking Sydney and San Francisco.
- Old Boys II In March Joe Isaacs (1992) was selected in the New South Wales Under 21 Athletics squad to tour Europe in August. His events are Javelin and Triple Jump.
- Flagship Of Education Regular readers will be pleased to hear that two splendid new flagpoles have been erected outside the McDonald Wing, near the Bear Pit, where a rather pathetic example once stood. As part of the refurbishment of this historic part of the grounds, the area has been flagged, and the Australian and School flags are regularly raised and lowered by a roster of cadets. On a sadder note, one of the two angled flagpoles in the courtyard of the main building has fallen down.
- **Spouting Forth** During fourth term the fountain in the main courtyard was brought back into commission, and after a lick of paint and a new pump, again enlivens this attractive part of the grounds.
- Short Service Commission As a result of the Headmaster's decision to shorten the period of probation served by Acting Prefects, the period of service of the 84th prefects was curtailed to just over two hundred days. They were ceremonially installed in office in early March, and ceremoniously replaced by the installation of

the 85th Prefecture in mid October.

- Two Hats For the first time in recent memory at least, the positions of Chairman of the School Union and Captain of the School are held by the same boy, David Eyers. This is very welcome, as he has the task before him in respect of the Union, which currently staggers along, apparently on its last legs. David is working closely with the Principal and Mr Selway, Master Assisting the Union, to redefine the role of this venerable body.
- **Out Of Sight** It is sad to note that "Tambourine Girl" still resides in the wood store, though thankfully standing up. She is in need of expert repair works to her marble base, after which she would be very much at home in the refurbished courtyard, perhaps within earshot of the fountain.
- **Demonstrations** As a result of analysis of future teaching space needs by the science department, the two Demonstration Rooms are undergoing changes. Room 24 is no longer tiered, and can be used as a standard classroom, although it still includes a demonstration bench. Room 25 will be joined with part of the former High Store to become a full laboratory, and the Science staffroom will also be extended.
- Meanwhile... Laboratories 25 and 26 will be refurbished, and given a modern laboratory layout. Also included will be a student independent research area, accessible from the corridor.
- **Under The Carpet** The long-awaited carpeting of the School has at last taken place, greatly reducing noise (and stress) levels throughout, especially in the old building.
- Ready And Willing (Old Boys III) Tommy Ng (1992), having just completed his first year of Commerce/Law at the University of New South Wales with great distinction, is taking a year's leave to train as an officer in the Ready Reserve. A month at Kapooka will be followed by six months at Duntroon, then a posting to the Ready Reserve Battalion. Upon returning to UNSW he will receive an Army scholarship to complete his degree, and probably a posting in a Ready Reserve Unit.

- **Old Boys IV** Joseph Waugh (1987) has been awarded First Class Honours in Law at Sydney University. He now awaits anxiously the result of the ballot for places at the College of Law.
- Scholarly Start Mr Watson, the Careers Master, is delighted to report that three members of Year 12 this year have secured University of New South Wales Co-op Scholarships: Joel Cohen and Zev Friedman in Business Information Technology, and David Pointing in Materials

#### Annual Tertiary Awareness Symposium

The event was held in March, and was an opportunity for Year 12 students from local schools to gain information, and to focus on the future.

Many boys built on this initial contact by arranging interviews with me, by visiting various universities, or by choosing to contact a workplace relevant to their chosen courses or careers.

#### **Guest Speakers**

Although there was a smaller number of speakers this year, this program remains a valued part of Careers offerings throughout the year.

#### Work Experience

This year a total of 227 boys took 243 placements, as follows:

Year 10:	180 took 196 placements,
Year 11:	35 took 35 placements, and
Year 12:	12 took 12 placements.

The majority of placements went to the professions, whereas an interesting numbers chose the arts, and the electrical and building trades. A number of boys gained extra experience with their employers, and some undertook part-time or permanent part-time work. Year ten boys were also required to prepare a CV, and to submit an after-action work experience report.

#### Scholarships

Several boys won scholarships to assist with their university studies, including three Co-op Scholarships awarded by the University of New South Wales. David Pointing won his scholarship in the field of Materials Science, whilst Zev Friedman (pictured) and Joel Cohen will both study Business Information Technology.

# Sydney High School Cadet Unit

The Cadet Unit has had another very successful year, beginning in first term with intensive weekly elementary training for recruits, and advanced skills training for the senior cadets. This phase was completed by the Annual Bivouac, a camp of two nights duration, held in the Marra Marra National Park, north of Galston, on the first weekend of second term. The remainder of second term was devoted to preparation for the Annual Camp.

The Unit conducted its 1993 Annual Camp in the crown land on Fagan's Ridge (near Galston) from Saturday 19 JUN 93 to Friday 25 JUN 93. A small advance party under command of Lt Ian Barratt moved into the area on the morning of 18 JUN 93 having drawn stores and rations from 21 Supply Battalion at Moorebank.

Lt Barratt was assisted by Lt Warren Cree (of SGS Cadet Corps) and Mr Sean Creer (formerly of 20 RCU), and had the use of a hired truck and an Army truck, provided by our foster unit (BASC Randwick), for the transport of stores and rations. The Army provided the loan of stores, and we were permitted to purchase seven days' rations, including the usual two days' of one-man one-day rations, which are always the cadets' favourite (apart from the Unit Barbecue).

The under-officers (Ben Gunsberger and Serdar Bolen) performed their duties very well, especially CUO Gunsberger who had the dual role of platoon commander and Senior Under Officer. Each had the opportunity to plan and conduct a major exercise (as did several Senior NCOs), all of which were successfully completed. These included lantern stalks, bullring testing, navigation exercises, overnight treks, an obstacle course, and a tactical exercise.

The senior NCOs (WO2 Sam Haeata, Ssgt Luke Bannister, and Sgts Luc Farago, Ross Cable, Joe Suttie, Matt Alexander and Mark Whitworth) proved to be highly effective. Sam Haeata was a fine CSM, leading by quiet example, and the platoon sergeants, Farago and Cable, organised their platoons very well. In particular Sgt Farago demonstrated very effective leadership when his platoon commander was injured in difficult terrain. He organised his evacuation, and later took command of the platoon on two other occasions as it moved through very difficult country. Ssgt Luke Bannister was again the senior boy in the Quartermaster's Store, assisted only by Cpl Ben Ng, and their work was of a high standard throughout.

The junior NCOs are a strong group, the best of whom are Cpl Ben Ng and Cpl Phillip Wong. All however led their sections effectively, and a high standard of campcraft was achieved.

The standard of training exercises was very high, reflecting good planning and effective preparation of orders on the part of the senior boys. The cadets seemed pleased with each phase of camp, especially the treks, where they spent thirty-six hours under the sole supervision (apparently) of their platoon staff.

There were no serious logistical difficulties. The support provided by the School for purchase of rations was again both timely and vital. Annual Camp 1993 was a great success, but a different site must be found, possibly in the Southern Highlands, for next year's Annual Camp.

Since camp, the unit has concentrated on weapons training, developing skills in both rifle drill, and the safe delivery of aimed fire. Range practices were held on both the School smallbore range and the Malabar Range, in both instances with the welcome assistance of the Rifle Club. Several cadets are achieving very high scores, particularly at full bore.

During the July holidays three cadets attended, and two (CUO Serdar Bolen and Cpl Ben Ng) qualified at the Adventure Training Award assessment held at Singleton. In the September holidays a group of senior cadets conducted a short bivouac in the Blue Mountains near Linden, to prepare for the promotion courses held in December in conjunction with Sydney Grammar School Cadet Corps.

The other important activity during Fourth Term

was the recruiting of new members, mainly from Year 7.

The Cadet Unit continues to provide very effective training for all its members. Every boy who joins Cadets gains from it, initially in areas of personal presentation, self-discipline, and elementary knowledge of military arts, including campcraft, mapreading and navigation. Those who seek promotion grow markedly in confidence and personal stature, and those who serve in Years 11 and 12 gain invaluable experience in planning, organising and conducting activities. Without exception the Under Officers of this Unit are outstanding and accomplished young men.

Finally the thanks of all who served this year go to the Officers, Under Officers and NCOs, and to the school family, for their vital contributions.

## **Rugby Master's Report**

The 1993 season was a successful one for most of our teams - all bar one recording at least one victory, and the First XV only one defeat. Coaches and players in every grade developed their skills, and the support provided by parents and Old Boys was outstanding.

Very early in the season eight boys underwent training as junior referees under the instruction of Mr Peter Meagher, all of whom received their qualification, and several of whom controlled matches during the season. These and other boys, and a very experienced group of adult referees, gave sterling service through seven home fixtures, as did the appointed referees for the competition matches.

The annual matches against Scots Bathurst were played at McKay this year, and the fixtures against The Armidale School were played away, TAS proving to be very accommodating hosts. These two fixtures have been highly successful in recent years, and this season was no exception. We look forward to hosting Armidale next season, and to visiting Bathurst.

Whilst the 13s had a difficult season of building skills and taking hard knocks, the 14s were able to be more competitive. The 14As had six wins and a draw, and scored in every match except one. The 15As also had their share of success, including winning three matches in the Buchan Shield Knockout, eventually losing in an away match against Blacktown. game to 5-4. The general consensus at the end of the season was that this was the best match that any of us had played in, and it typified our no nonsense style of play and courageous fighting qualities.

Hurstville were expected to be every bit as good as Blakehurst and we had to also face them on their home ground. With a large group of Hurstville students watching, it was surprising the support we got. The number six was their captain and it was his volley that opened the scoring in the second half. That victory put us through our group, the first time this had been achieved by a Sydney High team. Our next task was to overcome one of the other group's winners for the right to go to the quarter finals.

Luckily our next match was at home, our opponents Whitebridge High School, had to make the trip down from Newcastle. With them they not only brought a bus full of supporters, but also cheerleaders. The match was uninspiring – we played below ourselves and gave them much more chance in the game than we should have. The goal that settled it was an own goal from their captain and star player.

This poor form did not change in the semi final against a school from Dubbo. A big High crowd had come to watch at Sydney Athletic Field and were shocked when the referee awarded a controversial penalty against us. Adam Pold was not going to be beaten in front of such a crowd and saved brilliantly. The Dubbo team's tactics seemed to be to spoil rather than play football. Three minutes from the end Jimmy Aschner headed in a cross to deny them of their game plan of forcing extra time and penalties.

So it was down to the top four teams in the state, our opponents Westfields High School, a sports school where the focus is on sports rather than schoolwork (sounds familiar!). Injuries to key players Jono Tillsley, Paul Jones and Danny Rickwood among others meant we were seriously understrength and we were facing a team that boasted plenty of rep players and National League juniors, so we were not given much chance prior to the game. We started strongly in the second half having an effort by Jimmy cleared off the line and applying plenty of pressure. #### **CIS Cup**

The Combined Independent Schools Cup is a knockout competition for schools from the GPS, CAS and the ISA. In the first round we faced Waverley College at Queens Park in a quagmire. It had been raining constantly for several days before the match, and the game was little more than a training exercise, High coming off with a convincing 4-1 victory. This victory set us up for a return match against the strong Scots College side. The game after ninety minutes went straight into a penalty shoot-out, as a result of poor light. Perhaps it shouldn't have gone this far as we squandered many chances to put them away. In any case we snuck through for the semi final match against Trinity Grammar. Trinity are a respected CAS soccer team, but we caught them on a bad day and we humbled them 4-0 to assure us a final berth.

We had never played St. Patricks before so they were somewhat of an unknown quantity. They had come through the other side of the draw against teams such as Newington and Knox. The final at Christie Park attracted large groups of supporters from both sides for our only night match of the season. A penalty in the first half from skipper Jeremy Wong saw us go to the break with a 1-0 lead. Twenty minutes into the second half a St. Patricks defender was sent off for his second bookable offense. Within minutes a break down the right led to a second goal by Jeremy. However St. Patricks did not lie down and forced Adam Pold into making several outstanding saves. # **Rifle Shooting**

This year has seen the rifle club continue to grow into an extremely active organisation with a number of excellent individual results recorded at both the smallbore and fullbore. The GPS Annual Shoot was held at the Hornsby Rifle Range on 20th and 21st July. In the 500m Rawson Cup, Nathan Scudder scored a "possible" of 35.1. The N.R.A. Shield, held over 600 metres, saw Ben Edwards top score with 47.1 out of 50. The final match, the Buchanan Shield, conducted at 300m, saw Daniel Lewkovitz shoot a perfect score of 40.3. Overall the team finished with 1372.40, beating our previous year's score by 130 points.

During 1993, members of the Club have competed in a number of other competitions. Nathan Scudder won 13th place in C-Grade in the New South Wales Queen's Prize Meeting in May. In June, three shooters contested the 42nd Annual Wingham Rifle Championships, with excellent results recorded. Nathan Scudder came 3rd in C-Grade, winning the bronze medal and a number of other prizes, Daniel Lewkovitz came fourth in the C-Grade Sweepstakes, and 3rd at 600 yards. In October, at the Cessnock Open Championships, Nathan Scudder came 2nd in C Grade with an overall total of 143.10 over three ranges, missing out on first place by only one point.

Smallbore shooting has progressed very well. On behalf of all club members, I would like to thank our smallbore range officers, Mr Fergusson and Mr Govendir, for the time and effort that they have put into the Club. Sydney High School competes in a regular smallbore postal competition with other GPS schools, which enables our junior members to become involved in open competition before moving on to fullbore shooting in their senior years.

In August, after discussions with the Headmaster and other Club officials, it was decided to conduct a rifle club tour to the United Kingdom in June, 1994. Preparations for the Tour are well under way. Immediately following the announcement of the Tour, nominations were called for from members of the Club, and regular training days have been conducted at the ANZAC Rifle Range at Malabar. The tour is aimed at establishing links with schools in the United Kingdom, and providing more experienced shooters with the opportunity to represent their school abroad. The additional fullbore practice associated with the Tour will certainly assist the team in preparation for the GPS Annual Shoot next year.

On Wednesday, 1st December, 1993 the Rifle Club hosted the 2nd Annual End of Year Shooting Championships. The first match contested was the Club Championship. This match was won by Philip Wong, with a score of 89. Certificates were issued to the highest scoring shooter in each school year. The second match, the Teams Event, involved two teams competing for a set of eight medals. The Students' Team won this event, with a score of 660. A combined Staff, Old Boys and Parents' Team was also entered, finishing with a score of 580.

The Second Annual End of Year Championships were well attended by staff, students and parents, who all enjoyed this social event. Unfortunately, the present smallbore range, which was needed for classroom space, had to be dismantled at the end of the year. It is hoped that a new range will soon be built elsewhere to accommodate the growing rifle club for weekly practice.

On behalf of the Club, I would like to thank our Shooting Master, Mr Wigan for his commitment to the sport. Mr Wigan left the School at the end of 1993 and we would like to wish him all the best for the future. At the End of Year Championships, a number of special presentations were made. Three of our senior club officials were granted Life Membership after a vote of all members of the Club. Mr Blinkhorne, Mr Govendir and Mr Wigan were each presented with framed certificates.

A number of Year 12 students also presented a new Championship Cup to the Rifle Club. The Championship Cup was first presented in 1929, and was later won by J. W. Sweet, a prominent Australian rifle shooter. The Cup itself was lost sometime later, however and it was the decision of these outgoing students to revive the Cup from 1994 onwards. This new cup will be awarded annually by the Shooting Master, in a association with other training staff, to a deserving student (or students where necessary) who meets the following criteria:

- (a) outstanding performance at the GPS Annual Shoot, Smallbore competitions and events, and at other shooting activities, such as the Queen's Matches and Open Prize Meetings.(b) commitment to the sport and to training.
- (c) sportsmanship.

As outgoing Captain of Shooting, I would like to thank the Club members and officials who have assisted in the efficient running of the club, and to congratulate the 1994 Captain of Shooting, Philip Wong on his appointment. I am sure that we will see some excellent results in 1994.
