Welcome to all our returning staff and students to what we trust will be a better year of learning and achievement for High. I want to welcome our 180 Year 7 students and our 38 new students in Years 8, 9 and 11. I want to assure you of our commitment to foster your rapid and successful integration into the High culture. We have five priority actions. We nurture your academic growth through a wide range of subjects, courses and competitions. We develop you as a whole person through the format curriculum and a large variety of cocurricular activities. We try to promote in you a sense of belonging to High through encouraging full participation in our six-day programs. We endeavour to develop you as global citizens and future leaders through our community service and school leadership opportunities. 


The Andrews Memorial Library and the McDonald Library would like to extend a warm welcome to all students and parents for the 2023 academic year.

Informally known as the Junior and Senior Libraries, both libraries are critical centres for teaching and learning in the school. New students are encouraged to visit the library frequently to utilise both educational and recreational resources. Both libraries have wonderful collections of fiction and nonfiction titles that are forever growing and include many student recommendations. 'Wheelers', our e-library, contains thousands of ebooks and audiobooks, and students have access anywhere and at any time. In addition, a digital replica of the physical copy of the Sydney Morning Herald can be accessed via the school's intranet page.

The Junior Library is open every day from 7:30 AM, as well as Recess and Lunchtime, and closes at 3:30 PM. The Senior Library opens at 8:00 AM every day, and closes at 3:15 PM Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Both libraries are closed when their respective cohorts do Afternoon Sport.

The library photocopiers can print, scan and copy, and students' printing accounts are charged accordingly.

Students can volunteer as Library Monitors as part of the school's Award Scheme program. The library monitors provide an invaluable service by assisting with tasks to keep the library running smoothly. This includes shelving books, helping process new collection items, changing book cover displays, taking recycling downstairs, shelf-checking and tidying the collection, and helping with any other tasks that need doing around the library.





In 2022 we consolidated the school's manga collection into the Junior Library. We now have over 1000 manga volumes and will be getting a new batch early in Term 1. Our collection includes popular titles like One Piece, Akira, Mob Psycho 100, Tokyo Ghoul, Spy Family, Attack on Titan, Dragon Ball Z, Jujutsu Kaiken and many more. There are hundreds of titles available, and dozens of volumes for each title, so we can't purchase them all, but the libraries are always open to suggestions for new manga or any other books for our collection. Students can, of course, borrow books from either of the two libraries, and return them to either library as well.

Dr Love will be giving a number of presentations to new Year 7 students in the first half of Term 1 about the Junior Library, accessing and using library resources, and the Premier's Reading Challenge. New students from other years, and of course continuing students, can ask the librarians for help or information at any time.

Later this term, Ms Hinton will be giving note-taking presentations to all the Year 10 cohort.

For returning students, all library books are now due back. This includes books borrowed at the end of term, as well as books that were due back sometime last year. Please return books you have finished ASAP, so that we can have them available for other students to borrow. If you would like to keep them longer, you can renew them online, or bring them in for us to return and reissue to you. Any English textbooks that students are not using this year are also due back now. These are school resources that will be needed for other students this year, so please return them immediately. Parents need to be aware that unreturned books will incur a fee to cover the replacement cost of the resources, so please check with your son that he has returned everything that is due.

Sydney Boys High School Weights Room

Please be aware that the school's weights room is open and <u>free</u> for trial until the 10 March. The weights room is a great place for students to improve their movement competency, confidence and learn a great life skill. The weights room is always supervised, and programs are designed to progressively increase skill, strength and power.

The weights room is open 7-9am Monday – Friday and 3:15 - 5pm Monday and Wednesday. We also open the weights room up during the school holidays. *When new to the weights room we ask that students arrive no later than 7:15am to allow for a smoother introduction to the weights room.* There is no formal booking process when trialling, students just need to arrive on time and introduce themselves to the coach.

Payments can be made online.

Costs for this service are held down to a minimum and reduced by boys taking out a full year's membership. For 2023, a full year Weights Room membership costs just \$285. Boys wishing to have full year membership must register and pay by Friday, March 10, 2023.




