Sydney Boys High School has a long and proud rugby history. We have had some great rugby internationals as Old Boys—Peter Johnson, Chris Whitaker, Peter Crittle, Keith Cross, Syd King, John Brass – but none more influential than John Thornett. He was School Captain in 1951, played in the first XV and rowed in the first VIII for two years. He held school records in breaststroke U13s to U16s. He represented NSW in Water Polo. He was Captain of Australia in 16 tests and 47 tour matches during eight international tours with the Wallabies. He was the second player to play 100 games for his country. Claimed by some as Australia's greatest ever rugby captain, he 'was solid, dependable, unwavering, a man of undoubted modesty' – 'a man of sterling character and high ethics'. In his



long career (1955-1967) John played 37 test matches and 77 representative fixtures in the Australian team. He was inducted into the Wallabies Hall of Fame in 2005. As a person and a player, John Thornett was a

fine sporting role model who made history at High and served his country proudly. Check out his blazer and portrait next to Mr Kay's office. All you representative players have an opportunity this season to add to the High story and tradition. It is not so much the score that counts as how you played the game – as sportsmen...with courage, integrity and dedication. I congratulate our GPS representative players on their selection into the first and second grade teams of our winter sports and wish that all our boys who have made GPS teams grow as competitors and as people during the season, whatever the outcomes of their contests may be'.

Sentence Combining

Practising sentence combining effectively teaches grammar and usage; encourages students to produce more complex sentences; enables students to see various options for crafting sentences; exposes students to varied writing structures and enhances syntactic flexibility; helps students focus on what is important to include in a sentence; and improves fluency in writing. Give students a series of short declarative sentences and have them find various ways of combining those sentences into one longer, complex sentence. E.g. The topic was black holes. The teacher explained the physics well. I found it hard to understand. Even though the teacher explained the physics of black holes well, I found the topic hard to understand.

PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE BOOKS IN THE JUNIOR LIBRARY

For the month of June, I'm devoting our new bay of themed display shelves to books that are on the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) booklists. I will be including books from the 7-9 and the 9+ lists, but junior students can also read books from the 5-6 lists. A complete list of PRC books in the library can be found through the library catalogue, so please ask if you're not sure. And, of course, any books in the library can be added to your Reading Record as Personal Choice books, but you need to read 10 books on the PRC booklists.

I will be giving students an idea of the wide range of books that are on the booklists, including a number of picture books, and some thin books for people who find opening a very thick book too daunting! I see many popular series (Alex Rider, Percy Jackson, Hunger Games) coming up in multiple students' Reading Records, and I am trying to encourage a variety of texts. Try a new author, or a new genre. If you liked an author's YA books, try their books for adults. The PRC is a Challenge, so challenge yourself!

The PRC closes on August 18, so there are still 2½ months to read books and add them to your Reading record. Don't forget that any books that were read in term 4 last year, the summer holidays, term 1 this year, the Easter holidays, and term 2 can all be included. This also includes texts that were read in English class, as well as non-fiction books. We have already had 30+ boys complete this year's challenge, reading and adding 20 books to their Records. We have over 200 students signed up this year, and I want as many as possible to complete the Challenge!
















Annual Music Camp

The procedures for early leave are as follows:


Students must bring a note to the office that has been signed by both a parent AND a Deputy Principal BEFORE 8.55am Monday to Thursday and 9.25am Friday.
