



Tell Them from Me Survey 2023 (cont.)

In our SIP (Strategic Improvement Plan), we are focused on the learning process and how well certain skills are being acquired. It is agreed that explicit instruction is a good way to build capacity in students. 'Students feel classroom instruction is well-organised, with a clear purpose, and with immediate feedback that helps them learn'. Yes at High 71% v State 64%. During the life of our SIP we would hope to raise this perception to 75% or higher. 'Students understand there are clear rules and expectations for classroom behaviour'. SBHS 68% State 56%. Our class rules relate to enacting our stated values of respect, comparison, dedication and integrity. We have some work to do to operationalise these values as virtues (values in action). We will display the Department's Code of Conduct in every teaching and learning space.

The learning environment is an important catalyst (positive or negative) on student learning. To what extent are your learning spaces – equipped with technology that helps me learn 76% (agree/strongly agree); the learning spaces help me learn 55%; the learning spaces are neat and tidy 60%. I am not

completely confident that the respondents understood the statements fully in respect of learning climate. Also, having had BYOD access to CANVAS and the network for many years, as well as Vivi, students take their environment for granted. Overall, the survey provides us with large scale data on our core business from the perspective of our students. While the survey is flawed and students are sick of redoing it annually, at least the weaknesses are now constants, so we can look at changes and trends more carefully to inform our future practice. We know some areas need improvement in the eyes of our students. We are listening and acting.



Sentence Conscious Pedagogy: Revising and Editing the Draft

Revising means clarifying or altering the content of structure of a draft to make the writing clear, accurate, fluid, sequenced and coherent. Anticipate what information that the reader will need or want to know. Practising revision activities helps develop clarity and coherence; enables students to use sentence strategies when writing at length; provides a way of incorporating substantive changes into a piece of writing in addition to mechanical ones; and leads to more smoothly flowing and more logically connected prose. Editing involves identifying and then correcting errors in grammar, punctuation, capitalisation, syntax and spelling. Revising needs to come before editing. Practise applying the processes to a teacher-provided bare-bones paragraph. Practise inserting transitions and varying sentence structure. Clarity and accuracy are the goals.

In attendance at this event, we were fortunate to have General the Honourable Sir Peter Cosgrove AK AC (Military) CVO MC (Retired), Patron of the ADF Cadets, Colonel Andrew White, Brigadier Robert Lording, Dr Kim Jaggar, President of Paddington-Woollahra RSL Sub Branch Terry Farley and thirty Old Boy cadets from 1950s to 2021. The Hosting Officer was SHSCU Lieutenant AAC Ronald Luo.


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
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
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
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ROAD CLOSURES

This year, due to course changes, **road closures will be more significant** and vehicle movements around the course will be limited for the majority of the day. Residents are urged to avoid unnecessary travel on event day as extensive road closures will be in place with significant detours that will lead to longer travel times.

- » Major roads and cycleways will be closed between 4am and 3pm in the Sydney CBD, The Rocks, Millers Point, Barangaroo, Pyrmont, Darlinghurst, Moore Park and Centennial Park.
- » The Sydney Harbour Bridge, Cahill Expressway, and Western Distributor will be closed in both directions from 4am-10am.
- » Major roads will be closed from the Sydney Opera House in the city through Darlinghurst to Moore Park, including Macquarie St, College St, Park St and sections of Oxford St and Flinders St between 4am and 3pm. Drivers will be unable to travel east or west across the course.
- » The Sydney Harbour Tunnel, Eastern Distributor, Victoria Rd and the Cross City Tunnel remain open; however, delays are expected.
- » The Cross City Tunnel will be toll-free from 5am-3pm for motorists needing to drive on event day.
- » King St Wharf and Barangaroo: from 5am to 8.30am entry and exit via Wheat Rd, access from Harbour St. After 8:30am entry and exit via Erskine St.

SPECIAL EVENT CLEARWAYS

- » Special event clearway parking restrictions will be in place from 1am-3pm on roads in the city, Pyrmont and Moore Park and from 12:15am (midnight)-11am in North Sydney.
- » Clearways are strict no-parking zones and apply to local residents and TfNSW Mobility Scheme Permit holders. Clearways are in place to clear the racecourse of vehicles for the safety of participants.
- » Check the yellow signage carefully when parking on Sunday as well as the night before – vehicles left in clearways will be towed and a fee applies.
- » If your vehicle is towed, call the Traffic Information Line on 132 701 to find its new location.
