## EARLY BIRD DISCOUNT

#### Early Bird Discounts

For much of what we do as a six-day school, particularly on Saturdays, High is a self-help, selffunded organisation. In order to help maintain all of our many activities we offer a substantial discount to parents who pay all their invoices in full before Friday, March 16. It is not only a great demonstration by them of their commitment to the ethos of the school but also, it's an encouragement for others to follow their lead and it helps to create a critical mass of financial support for our programs. The rest comes from the support of parents and the efforts made by School Family volunteers, helping in fund raising. Having substantial funds early in the year allows us to make sure that capital works are completed in the holidays, orders are made promptly and that the boys get the maximum benefit out of equipment and services deployed for them this year. Quality services, extra staff and high standards come at a high price. A very large number of parents see the package as value for money and contribute in full.

The early bird discount is available for students who were invoiced in 2024 and doesn't apply to new students who were invoiced in October 2023 and subsequently came to Orientation Day in November and had the opportunity to pay all invoices on that day and obtain the discount. New Year 7-11 boys who were not made offers before Orientation Day and hence could not attend, are eligible for the discount. Returning students in Years 8-12 have the chance to make a saving by paying in full by Friday, March 16.

Last year, **72.95% of families** saw the benefit of supporting the school in **all of its activities** early in the year and thereby earned **the early bird discount**. Together they saved **\$221,260**. I thank them sincerely for their support. We achieved our target and reset our 2024 target to attract **73%** of parents this year. Let's carry on High's self-help culture to make sure we achieve our goals for your sons in 2024 and beyond! Education at High is real value for money!

Recounts are retellings of past events. They are usually written as a series of events in the order in which they happen. Structure. *Orientation* The first stage tells us about 'who, what, where and when', to help the reader place the events in time and place. *Series of events*. The second stage is the retelling of the events in sequence. What are the language features of a recount? Illustrative words are used to construct a description of the world in which the events are taking place. Typically, the past tense is used to relate the events. #### Meet the Prefect – Christopher Lau



What is taking Music as a subject like at High? At the school, Music 2 is offered as an accelerated subject, meaning you would finish it in year 11. The actual subject comprises of many components, such performance, composition, as and musicology. It gets very stressful around Term 3, especially during our Trials. In my year, the 8 or so students who did accelerate music were pushed to their limits, and though it was rough, it was a good experience for us, before heading into our final year. I also take Music Extension, which for me, involves performing three pieces, two solos and one ensemble piece.

#### What is it like doing Cross Country?

Most students will see Cross Country listed as a sport on their Winter ballot and immediately say no. Cross Country is hard, there is no denying that. But unlike other sports, Cross Country is simple. In the words of a prefect from the class of 23' "you put one foot in front of the other". XC involves about 20km of training during the week and an 8km run on Saturday (if you are a senior). This training includes two hard sessions, such as tempo runs, interval sessions and hill runs, and one easy session to recover. The Saturday competitions are held at each school, with the High Invitational being at Centennial Park.

#### What do you enjoy about playing Basketball?

Basketball is a high intensity sport which no doubt requires physical endurance and skill. However, though the individual ability of each player is important, it's also about how well you can play as a team. Basketball is like a game of chess. When you see your opponent bring out a different strategy, you need to adjust and be prepared. It is much more than the flashy highlights you see on Instagram. It's about whether your team brings energy off the bench, whether you can break through a full court press in the clutch, or whether you are willing to do the dirty work and box out for a rebound. There's no hiding the fact that the 1st and 2nd grade teams at Sydney Boys are smaller than the rest of the AAGPS teams. However, the energy and teamwork which our school brings to each Saturday is in my opinion unmatched. And the company of my teammates is what makes basketball so enjoyable for me.

#### What is the role of the Year 8 Prefect?

Year 8 students, having only experienced one year at High, still have many new high school experiences ahead of them. Being a Year 8 Prefect entails taking on a leadership role within the school community to establish a positive role model for Year 8 students to follow. Alongside this, I am also responsible for upholding school rules, assisting teachers with tasks and aid in organising events. Ultimately, I act as a bridge between Year 8 students and teachers, helping to continue to nurture future scholar sportsmen.

## What is your most memorable experience at High?

Reflecting on my life at High all the way back to Year 7, one of my most memorable experiences would surprisingly be an unsuspecting one - during a rare occurrence where most prefects, if not all, had gathered around in the Bear Pit and were chatting, joking, laughing. The feeling of joy completely overwhelmed my heart, as I looked around at all the faces, causing me to reminisce on how many friends and fun memories I had made throughout my school life. It felt surreal that these would be the faces that would forever be etched into my life. This will continue to be present later in my life. I couldn't remember how long ago I had become friends with each of them, but I learnt an important lesson, no friendship is an accident.

### What does the title of Social Media Prefect entail?

Social media is a double-edged sword that has integrated itself into our modern lives. Through it, ill-intended users can conduct various forms of cyberbullying and abuse. However, when used well, it can serve as a powerful tool that builds strong connections and fosters positivity and enthusiasm. As the Social Media prefect of 2024, I lead the events team of the Prefect body, which collectively manages the Prefects social media account as well as important creative projects. Whilst the social media account is important for building lasting relationships with other schools, the account is also used to promote significant events such as Head of the River and the AAGPS Swimming Carnival, as well as other important dates such as Teacher's Day. By doing this, students become more aware of what's going on during their school life, which encourages participation that ultimately enhances one's experience at High.



What does being a part of High's Music Program look like?

High boys are offered the opportunity to participate in a range of musical ensembles and bands as a cocurricular activity. This range accommodates for a multitude of interests and skill levels. Whether you seek elegance and perfection as a strings elitist or if you seek to feed your Soul (with a capital S), the music program most definitely has an ensemble for you. Members of each ensemble are required to attend weekly rehearsals where students are led by a conductor in preparation for the school's semesterly music concerts. The first music concert is held around the midpoint of the year after the annual music camp. At music camp, students get to spend a few days away rehearsing with their ensemble and bonding with their band mates. In the second half of the year, boys in the music program continue to attend rehearsals to eventually showcase the fruit of their labour at the end of year music concert. In addition to the concerts and music camp, several workshops are run each year (with some exciting ones coming soon) to aid the boys in their musical endeavours. The High music program overall is an engaging way for boys to indulge in their musical interests and showcase their talent and hard work.

All of this is organised and overseen by the music department and the GOAT head of music Ms Kim.
