Seeing the boys get excited about everything from push up challenges, inter-school debates, to staff vs students' events is fantastic and really enhances our school culture. Thank you to all those involved for your efforts and providing a platform for these continuing into the future, leaving a lasting legacy on the whole school community.

#### Parent Teacher Interviews

On Monday night we held the Parent Teacher Interviews for Year 7. By all accounts, this went very smoothly and allowed the parents to gain further understanding of how their sons are progressing in their first semester in the school. Year 10 and 11 parents would have received their invites this week to next term's event. Please notify the front office if you haven't received this email as we don't want anyone missing out on this important part of our school calendar.

This week all Year 10 students met with me to

receive their Semester 1 reports. Unlike the junior school reports, these indicate the score and rank for each individual subject which are used to provide an estimated ATAR for the boys. I highly recommend parents discussing their son's reports with them to see how much they are enjoying and are engaged with each of their subjects.

Towards the end of Term 3, Year 10 will be selecting their course preferences for the Preliminary HSC and this most recent report will provide an excellent guide on what they should be pursuing. The most important considerations in deciding which courses to study for the HSC are a student's performance in the corresponding Year 10 course, as well as his level of enjoyment. The learning behaviours are a great indicator of whether a student is engaged in the course and should be a strong consideration in discussions of whether or not they should continue with this subject into Year 11.



#### NAIDOC Week

This week we also held our NAIDOC assembly in preparation for NAIDOC Week celebrations from 7 to 14 July during the school holidays. This year's theme is "Keep the Fire Burning! Blak, Loud and Proud" to honour the vitality of First Nations culture. Fire is a symbol of First Nations people's connection to the land, to Country and to each other over many generations. It's important that Australia celebrates stories, traditions the and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities through events such as this and it was great to have Dub Leffler here to help raise awareness of its significance.

On Tuesday I spoke with all of Year 11 on various matters, including the need to refine their learning behaviours and get into good habits before they commence the HSC in Term 4. Evidence indicates that when an individual

develops a skill over time, it gradually becomes an activity they don't have to consciously think about and becomes something they automatically do, freeing up their working memory. For example, an individual first learning to ride a bike is only focused on balancing, while an experienced rider's mind would be free to scan for any potential dangers and could simultaneously have a conversation with fellow riders.

Students in all year groups are strongly encouraged to develop their various learning behaviours to create the habit of engaging in class activities, organising themselves, listening to and applying feedback provided, and importantly, knowing how to effectively create written responses. Under examination conditions, automatically being able to recall how to write extended responses rather than deciding at the time how to structure their work, would free up students' working memory and allow them to better apply their knowledge and understanding to the question at hand. I highly recommend the boys begin this process of automaticity from early in their secondary schooling, to ensure that writing effectively becomes as second nature to them as riding a bike, playing an instrument, or adding two numbers together can be through practice.



And on a final note, to wind up Term 2, I'd like to thank all our students for their ongoing engagement in the wide variety of academic and co-curricular activities on offer here at High. Looking over each student's report, the levels of participation by the boys has really lifted this year, providing them with a rich array of experiences that will be highly beneficial to their futures.

To all our teachers who continue to deliver quality learning experiences for the boys, while providing feedback to help each student maximise their performance in the second semester, I'd like to give my personal thanks for your ongoing dedication. Term 2 is always the busiest period of the year, with assessment blocks, reports and parent-teacher nights, so I'm sure they will all enjoy some well-earned rest over the break.

I'd also like to thank all the support staff across the school, our coaches and volunteers who help us deliver a quality learning environment in various aspects of the boys' learning. There are so many involved in various roles including the office staff, groundskeepers, P&C,

School Foundation, School Council and Co-curricular bodies whose time and efforts are invaluable to the boys' education. The whole school community really appreciate everything you do for the boys.

The following is information on the upcoming parentteacher night next term. We use a web based electronic scheduling system for arranging interviews. This produces better results for all participants, especially more compact time schedules for both parents and teachers. The system works as follows:

N.B. The following dates are for <u>Year 10 and 11</u> parents only.

On Wednesday 3 July, all parents of boys in Year 10 and 11 were sent details of the scheduling system and a unique code to be entered via email. This code can only be used for the student allocated.

This scheduling email will be sent to the main family email address currently held by the school for **all Year 10 and 11 students**. If you have not received this email by Term 3 - Week 1, please check your junk mail or any alternative email addresses provided to the school by either parent, otherwise contact the school office. N.B. The office regularly receives queries about undelivered parent-teacher emails when the email was in their junk mail. Please check there before contacting the school.

If your email address has changed from what had been previously advised, you should notify the school at <u>office@sbhs.nsw.edu.au</u>. Please indicate your son's name and roll call class (or date of birth) so that the information can be forwarded to you.

Following the instructions in the email, on the Edval website you will see your son's teachers listed and you will be able to select those with whom you require an interview (if you hover over a teacher's name, the subject involved will be shown). At the same time, you can indicate your availability between **2:00pm and 7:30pm**. You should provide this information by **9am on** Wednesday 24 July.

The overall schedule will be generated by the school and your individual schedule should be available for you to download and print from 6pm on Thursday 25 July.

Interviews should not exceed five minutes' duration. If there is insufficient time, a further appointment may be arranged for a later date.

Similar arrangements will be in place for **all other year group interviews**. Keep an eye on future High Notes for the timing of these processes.

Standard 3.2.2A of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code introduces three mandatory food safety management tools for food businesses. School canteens across NSW have until 08 December 2024 to comply.



The Canteen Committee have assessed the rules and find the Canteen is able to demonstrate compliance in most areas, with the exception being the food handler training, due to our large, diverse number of volunteers.

The NSW Food Authority has developed a free online Food Handler Basics training course to help businesses meet their food handler training obligations which can be accessed via https://www.foodauthority.nsw.gov.au/ training/food-handler-basics-training.

Next term, the Canteen Committee will be requesting that all volunteers complete either the NSW Food Authority training or one of the in-house courses (under development), to be made available in other languages where possible.

More news will be provided on helping us achieve compliance to this standard next term.





We encourage students to place their lunch orders between 08:30 and 09:00 in person at the Canteen or anytime online via the Flexischools app or at flexischools.com.au.

By ordering lunch, you avoid missing out on your favourite foods (especially on days when there are special items on offer), decrease waiting times at recess and lunch as well as help reduce food wastage.

Please remember to pick up your orders. Any uncollected items will be sold, and unfortunately, refunds will not be provided unless there is a valid reason.

# 10 tips to successfully completing online consent for school vaccinations:

- 1. Make sure you are using the link provided to you by the school, <u>engage.health.nsw.gov.au</u>
- 2. It is recommended that you use a laptop or desktop computer with a Chrome browser.
- 3. Follow the prompts to log in, using your Service NSW account. If you do not have a Service NSW account, you will need to create one to provide online consent.
- 4. The first time you log in, you will be prompted to fill in <u>your</u> <u>personal details</u> before you can complete consent for your child.
- 5. Enter your name as it appears on your Medicare statement rather than how it appears on the card. Please enter any middle names in full, as initials may not be accepted.
- 6. Use **dashes** to separate the **DD-MM-YYYY** in yours and your child's date of birth.
- 7. Ensure you select the vaccines you want your child to receive. To receive both you must consent to both. Information about each vaccine is in the Parent Information Sheet.
- 8. Consent can be edited up to 24 hours prior to your child's school clinic. If you wish to change or withdraw consent after this time, please contact your child's school to advise them.
- 9. The consent site can get busy as it is used statewide. If its not working right away please come back and try again later.
- 10. If you're still having difficulties with providing consent please get in touch with South Eastern Sydney Public Health Unit, 02 9382 8333.
